



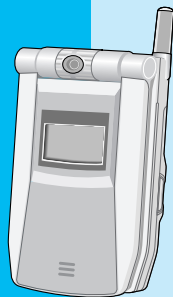

## For Your Safety

## How to insert the SIM Card

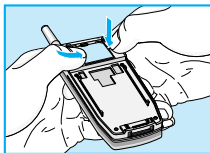
Before Use



1. Switch off the phone. Push up the button or the back of the phone and pull the battery away from the phone.



2. Insert the SIM card into holder. Make sure that the SIM card is inserted properly and that the gold contact area on the card is facing downwards. To remove the SIM card, push down the side of the SIM holder pushing the SIM card as shown.

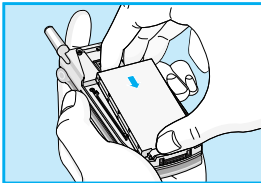

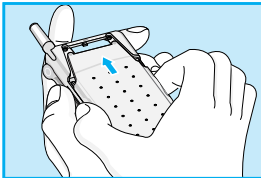
- Removing the battery from the phone whilst it is switched on may cause it to malfunction.

## How to install Battery

Before Use



1. Position the lugs on the bottom of the battery into the retaining holder. Then, push the top half of the battery into position.

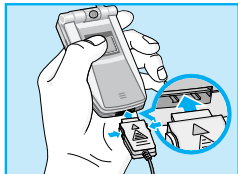


2. Slide the battery cover into position.

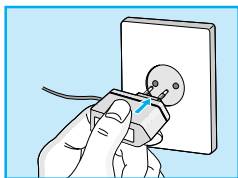
## How to charge the Battery

Before Use

To connect the travel adapter to the phone, you must have installed the battery.



1. With the arrow facing you as shown in the diagram gently push the plug on the battery adapter into the socket on the bottom of the phone until it clicks into place.



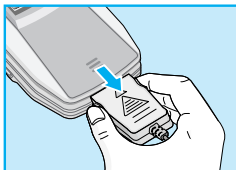
2. Connect the other end of the travel adapter to the main socket.  
Use only the included packing charger.

### Warning

- Do not force the connector as this may damage the phone and/or the travel adapter.

## How to disconnect the charger

Before Use



Disconnect the travel adapter from the phone by pressing its side buttons as shown in the diagram.

### **!** Notice

- Ensure the battery is fully charged before first using the phone.
- Do not remove your battery or the SIM card while charging.
- The moving bars of battery icon will stop after charging is complete.

### **!** Note

If the battery does not charge.

- Switch the phone off.
- Ensure the battery is correctly fitted.

## How to switch On and Off

Before Use


If you experience a problem with your phone whilst it is in use, or your phone will not switch off, remove and reinsert the battery. Then switch the phone on.



### Switching On

Hold down  key until you see the switch on graphic.

### Switching Off

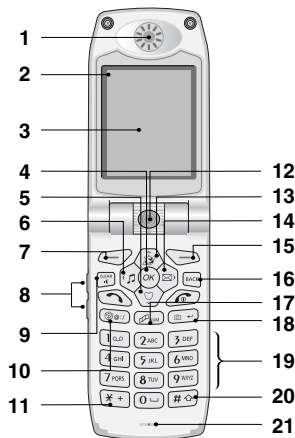
Press  key for about 3 seconds until you see the switch off graphic.

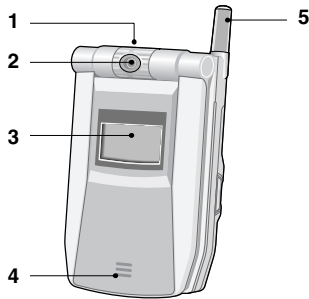

### Using the Menu



1. Open the folder and press  [Menu] key.
2. Press  or  key to select the desired menu, and press  [OK] key to execute. You could also directly execute the menu desired by pressing the corresponding number of the menu.
3. Press  to move to the preceding menu, and press  to return to the Standby Display.

### Making a Call

#### Making a voice call





1. Enter telephone numbers with area code in the Standby mode.
2. After entering the numbers, press  key to make the call.
3. Telephone numbers, name, current time, call duration time are presented on the display.
4. After making the call, press  key or close the folder to end the call.

#### Making an international call

1. Press  key two times in sequence or hold this key down until “+” is displayed.
2. Enter the phone number.
3. Press  [Send] key.






**! REFERENCE****• Entering and Saving Numbers**

- Pressing  key while entering numbers will delete numbers sequentially from the last, and holding the button down will delete all numbers.
- Pressing  or  key while entering numbers will move to the Standby Display.
- Press  [Save] to save the numbers you entered at the Contacts Registration Display.

**• Use Recent calls to Make a Call**





- Press  key from the Standby Display and select a number from the Recent Call List, then press  key to make a call.

**• Speed dial**

- Use speed dials saved in speed dial from the Standby Display to make a call or send a message.
- Press  [Search] key from the Standby Display to search for a telephone number, then press  key to make a call.
- Pressing  [Search] key while the phone is in use will enable search for other contacts; however, a call cannot be made to the searched number.


### Receiving a Call

#### Receiving a Voice Call

1. In case Folder open is set in answer mode, you can answer a call by opening a folder, or if the folding is open, by pressing any button except  and  when the folder is already opened.
2. If you set Send key in answer mode, you must press  to answer the call.
3. After the call, press  key to end the call, unless the other party disconnects first.

### Checking missed calls




You can check the number list of missed calls.

1. Missed Call and the number of missed calls are shown on the external LCD.
2. Pressing OK brings up the list of miss calls.
3. Select missed calls from the Last Call List and press  key to view the caller, telephone numbers and time call received. (Refer to **Recent calls** [Menu 2-1].)


### How to use Hotkeys

Use speed dials from the Standby mode to move to selected menu quickly. (Refer to Key description.)


#### View Menu

Press  [Menu] key from the standby mode to move to Menu, then press  or  key to execute various menus.



## Searching Contacts

Press  [Search] key from the standby mode to search for telephone numbers from Contacts and address for sending messages.


## Accessing Internet

Press  key from the standby mode to move to the Internet Menu, where access to Internet is available. If you long press the key, the phone will access the Home page.


## Message Menu

Press  key from the standby mode will directly move to the Menu. Hold down  key will move directly to the Write Message display, allowing you to write a message immediately. If you hold down the key, the phone moves to SMS write.

## My Menu

Press  key from the standby mode to directly move to My Menu, where you can add, delete, or edit the menu.


## Profile Setting

Press  key from the standby mode to move directly to the **Profile Setting**, where you can change current profile. If you hold down the key, Quiet profile is activated.


## Games

Press  key to directly move to Games menu.

### Multimedia

Press  key from the standby mode to directly move to the VOD Menu, where you can access VOD service and play video.

### Camera

Press  key from the standby mode to directly move to the Camera Mode, where you can take pictures, record videos.

### Voice Recording

Press Voice Recorder Key (See page17) at the upper portion of the phone from the standby mode to immediately record voice.

### How to read received Messages

Icon and letters alerting the message arrival will be shown in the external LCD. Reading incoming messages will depend upon how you preset, and you can change alerting mechanism under Settings [Menu 1-5].

### How to change the Display Theme

You can change Clock mode, Image and animation of Display Theme.



1. To change 'Time' or 'Date format', select 'Phone' from the Settings menu.
2. To change Clock mode (Analogue, Digital, Dual, Normal) or 'Display Theme', select 'Display' from the Settings menu and select 'Screen theme'.
3. If you select 'Image gallery' from Multimedia, you can change Display Theme into Image or Animation.

### ! REFERENCE

- In 'Screen theme' menu, you can also change the themes of Power On/Off.

## How to adjust the Keypad tone

Use side keys from the standby mode to adjust volume.

1. Press  key on the side of the phone from the standby mode to increase the volume.
2. Press  key on the side of the phone from the standby mode to reduce the volume.

## How to record a voice



In a standby mode, you can record a voice by pressing Voice Recorder Key (in the middle of the top).

1. If you press the key, the menu is moved to **Voice recorder**.
2. If you hold down the key, you can voice record directly.

## Recent Calls

You can read the last dialed, missed and received calls.

### Read Call List



1. Press  key in the standby mode.
2. Select the item to read from the Last Call List, then press  [OK].
3. Read the caller, telephone numbers, and the time of call.

## Standby Display


Basic Use

### Saving Phone Numbers



You can save unregistered telephone numbers from the Recent call list.

1. Select the unregistered telephone numbers from the Last Call List.
2. Select **Save as new** by pressing  [Option], to register a new name, then select icon to move to the Contact Registration display.
3. Select **Add to existed** by pressing  [Option] and register in Contacts through the Name Search Display to register under an existing name.
4. After registration, return to the Last Call List.

### Deleting Call List

1. Select the item you want to delete from the Call List, then press  [Option] key.
2. Select **Delete** to delete the item you selected.
3. Select **Delete all** to delete the entire items.

## In call menu

1. If you select **New call**, you can make a call.
2. If you select **SMS**, you can send a message during a call.
3. If you select **Search**, you can search phone book entries during a call.
4. If you select **DTMF On/Off**, you can set DTMF.
5. If you select **Mute On/Off**, you can set Mute.
6. If you select **Hold**, you can hold an active call.
7. If you select **Retrieve**, you can retrieve a held call.
8. If you select **End all calls**, you can disconnect all calls.
9. If you select **Call transfer**, you can connect the recipient with another party.
10. If you select **Join calls**, you can make a conference call.
11. If you select **Release**, you can disconnect one of the conference calls.
12. If you select **Participants**, you can check all participants in conference call.
13. If you select **Swap**, you can swap between an active call and a held call.

### Note

- Some of these services are dependent on your network operator.

## Messages [Menu 1]












### Menu functions

You can use your phone to send short messages, multimedia messages, and E-mail. You can also read and store received messages.

### Write [Menu 1-1]

You can write a multimedia message, email, or short message to send or save as draft.

#### SMS

1. Select **SMS** from Write message and press  [OK].
2. Select **SMS** from among the types of messages to send, then press  [OK].
3. Select  [Option] and select **Template, Emoticon** to use stored sentences or emoticon while writing a message.
4. You can select a picture, animation or sound by pressing  [Option].
5. After entering all items, press  [Ok] to move to **To Field**.
6. You can input phone numbers under **To Field** or recall the phone numbers from **Phonebook** by pressing  [Search].
7. Select  [Done] after inputting the phone number.
8. Select **Send message** and press  [OK].
9. Select **Save to draftbox** and press  [OK] to save in **Draftbox**.
10. When the message is sent, your phone asks whether you want to store the edited message.
11. Press Yes if you want to store it.

## Messages [Menu 1]



Menu functions

### MMS

1. Select **MMS** from the list of messages to send, then press [OK].
2. Select a format from the list to send, then press [OK].
3. Input phone numbers you wish to send to and press [Down] key. You can enter more than 1 recipient, and either the number directly enter or press [Search].
4. Select **Title** to enter title.
5. Select **Message**, then write a message.
6. To attach an image, select **Image** and select the image from the list of images to send, then press [OK] key.
7. To attach a music file, select **Audio**, and select the music file from the list of music files to send, then press [OK] key.
8. To attach a movie file, select **Video** and select the video file from the list of video files to send, then press [OK] key.
9. After entering all items, press [Done] key to send the multimedia message or save temporarily. To view before sending your message, select **Preview**.

## E-mail

1. Select **E-mail** from the list of **Write**, then press [OK] key.
2. Enter email address under **To** and press down key.  
You can enter more than 1 recipient and either directly enter or press **Search** for getting e-mail addresses or telephone numbers saved in the Phone book.
3. Select **Title** to enter title.
4. Select **Message** to write a message.
5. Select **Attach** to attach files. Press [search] and select **Video, Image** or **Animation**.
6. After entering all items, press [OK] key to send the email or save temporarily.

### How to Use T9

T9 allows you to input text quickly.

In T9, you only need to press the key with the corresponding letter once. This is based on a built-in dictionary to which you can also add new words.

#### - Writing words by using T9.

1. Start writing a word by using the keys **2 ABC** to **9 WXYZ**. Press each key only once for one letter. To write for instance 'girl', press **4 GHI**, **4 GHI**, **7 PQRS**, **5 JKL**. The characters that you enter appear blocked.

The word changes after each keystroke. Therefore you shouldn't pay too much attention to how the word appears on the display until you have pressed all the appropriate keys.

To delete a character to the left, press **←**. To change the character case, press **# ⇄**. To insert several numbers, press and hold **# ⇄** and key in the numbers.



Alternatively : Press **⇄** [Symbol] and select insert symbol. Select the desired character and press **OK**.

2. When you have finished writing the word, check that the word is correct.  
If the word is correct : Press **0 ↵** and write the next word.  
If the word is not correct : Search by scrolling with **✕ +**.
3. To insert a punctuation mark, press **1 ⌨** repeatedly until the desired mark appears.







• **Adding a new word in the dictionary**

When no word is blocked, you can add a new word in the dictionary in the following way:

1. Press  [option] and select **Add dictionary**.
2. Key in the word by using T9 and press .

• **Changing the language or turning T9 off**

1. In the **Write** menu, press  [Option].
  2. Select **Dictionary** and press .
  3. If you want to change the language used in T9, select the desired language and press .
- If you want to turn T9 off, select **Dictionary off** and press .

### SMS

#### • Read message

1. Select the desired message from Inbox, and press [OK].
2. You can view a long message by scrolling with , . If you press , , you can view the contents. The phone can play sound if you select the Sound icon. Press [Option] to save the desired message and you can use the contents when making a message later.







• **Read message option menu**

1. **Reply** : Replies immediately after viewing the message.
2. **Forward** : Forwards a selected message to another party.  
You can modify the message.
3. **Get number**: If the selected message has the phone numbers (more than 3 figures), you can extract and save it in Phonebook. Also, you can call this number.
4. **Delete** : Deletes the message.





• **Option menu**

Press  [Option] from Inbox.

1. **Multiple delete** : Press  key to select one or multiple messages, then press  [Delete] key to delete the selected messages.
2. **Delete All** : The phone deletes all the messages in the inbox.
3. **Delete** : Deletes the message.

**MMS**

• **Read message**


1. Select **Message alert** from Inbox, and press . Then, the phone will show the **Delivery report**.
2. Press  [Retrieve] to receive the desired message and show it. Press  [||] to pause, and press  [▶] to resume.
3. Press [Detail] for more details.





### • Read message option menu






1. **Reply** : Replies immediately after viewing the message.
2. **Forward** : Forwards a selected message to another party.  
You can modify the message.

### • Option menu

Press  [Option] key from the **Inbox**.


1. **Multiple delete** : Press  key to select one or multiple messages, then press  key to delete the selected messages.
2. **Delete All** : Deletes all the messages in the inbox.
3. **Information** : Shows the size of the attachment file and the time when a message was received.
4. **Delete** : Deletes the message.

### E-mail

1. Select **Option** and select **Get e-mail list**.
2. When you have several registered Email accounts, you can select an account.
3. Only mail headers will be received.
4. Press  to view the details of the mail headers. Or press  [Receive] to receive the mail contents.
5. Press  [Option] and select  [Delete] to erase e-mail in e-mail server and the Phone simultaneously.
6. Press  [Reply] to reply to the sender.



### • Option menu

Press  [Option] key from the Inbox.

1. **Get subjects** : Only mail headers will be received.
2. **Delete** : Deletes the selected message.
3. **Delete all** : Deletes only e-mails in the Inbox. E-mails in your phone are all deleted.



### • Read

1. Select a message to delete from the Outbox and press .
2. Press ,  to view a long message, and press ,  to select the contained contents. If Sound icon is selected, the sound plays.
3. Select  [Delete] to delete a message.





### • Read message Option menu

Press  [Option] key from the Outbox.

- 1. Forward** : Forwards the selected message to another party. You can modify the message.
- 2. Get number** : If the selected message has the phone number (more than 3 figures), you can extract and save it in a phonebook. Also, you can call this number.
- 3. Delete** : Deletes the message.

### • Option

Press  [Option] from Outbox.

- 1. Edit** : Edits the selected message.
- 2. Multiple delete** : Press  key to select one or multiple messages, then press  [Delete] key to delete the desired messages.

### • Delivery reports

If you set Yes in this menu, you can check whether your message is sent to the other party successfully or not.

1. Select **Delivery report** and press [Ok].
2. Press **On** to set Delivery report and press [Ok]. Press **Off** to cancel it already set.

### • Message types

#### **Text, Voice, Fax, X.400, E-mail, ERMES, National paging**

Usually, the type of message is set to **Text** type. You can replace your text with the alternative formats, which are suitable for the device that will be received the message. Contact your service provider for the availability of this function.



### • Validity period

This network service allows you to set how long your text messages will be stored at the message centre.



### • Message centre

You can set the Service centre number when you send a message.

1. Press  [Ok] and the phone will show Service centre address.
2. Press  [Edit] and write the desired address to set a new Service centre.

### • Pay for reply

When the other party replies to your message, you can pay for this.

## MMS

### • Delivery report

#### - Report request

You can check whether the outgoing message is sent successfully.

#### - Report allow

You can send a message whether you receive the message or not.

### • Read reply

#### - Report request

You can check whether the outgoing message is read or not.

#### - Report allow

You can send a message whether you read an incoming message or not.





- **Auto retrieve**

Skips the message alert to directly view the original message.

- **Validity period**


This network service allows you to set how long your text messages will be stored at the message centre.

- **Message timer**

Sends a mail at an appointed time. The message can be sent **immediately, 1 min later, 5 min later, 1 Hr later, 5 Hr later, 1 Day later** or **1 Week later** to choose from.

- **Connection**

You can select a network and modify your mail server provider list set in the phone.

1. **Access point description** : You can make a brief description on what this access point is for.
  2. **User name** : User name to access the access point name.
  3. **Password** : Password to access the access point name.
  4. **MMSC address** : Sets MMSC address using [Setup].
  5. **WAP IP address** : Sets WAP gateway address and port number using [Setup].
  6. **Bearer** : Select GPRS or CSD using Right key .  
For more information, contact your service provider.
- **Dial number** : If you select CSD as Bearer, you can input the dial number you want to key.
  - **Baud rate** : If you select CSD as Bearer you can select the baud rate.



- Access point name** : If you select GPRS as Bearer, you can see address of Gateway to contact e-mail server provides. For more information, contact your service provider.

### E-mail account

You can set up to 20 e-mail accounts to use e-mail.

- 1. Account description** : Explains what the account is needed for.
- 2. POP3 sever addr.** : The server address to receive e-mail.
- 3. User name** : User ID and Password to contact POP3 server.
- 4. Password** : Password to access the e-mail account.
- 5. SMTP server addr.** : Input the IP address to send e-mail.  
(e.g:170.30.52.59)
- 6. E-mail address** : You need email address to send e-mail.
- 7. Deletion option** : When deleting e-mail accounts, there are two options – delete both phone and server or delete only phone.

### Info. Service



Cell Broadcast messages (CB message) are text ones that are sent by the network to GSM phone users. The network provides general information such as weather reports, traffic news, tax, pharmacies, and stock prices. Each type of information has the number; therefore, you can contact service provider. When you receive CB message, you can view the submenus below:

- **CB On/Off**

You can set whether you receive cell broadcast message or not.




- **Channels**

You can check the selected channel index by pressing  [OK]. And you can edit, add or delete channels by pressing  [Option]. To activate or deactivate channels, press [Mark] or [Unmark].

- **Languages**

You can select the language pressing [Mark] or [Unmark]. Then, the cell broadcast message will be displayed in the language that you selected.

## Voice mail

If you press  [Option], you can check the following option menus.

- **Add**

You can add new voice mail centre number.

- **Delete**

You can delete the address of voice mail centre.

- **Delete all**

You can delete all voice mail address.

- **Edit**

You can edit the address of voice mail centre.






1. Select **Templates** from the Message Menu, then press  [OK] key.
2. Select the term desired from the Preformatted and Emoticons, then press  [OK] key.
3. You can view the terms entered.
4. To edit the terms, press  [Option], and select Edit, then press  [OK].
5. To add terms, press  [Add], then write a term and press  [Save] key.
6. To delete terms, press **Option**, then press **Delete** or **Delete All**.

### Emoticon [Menu 1-7]

1. Select **Emoticon** from the Message Menu, then press  [OK] key.
2. Select the term desired from the Preformatted and Emoticons, then press  [OK] key.
3. You can view the terms entered.
4. To edit the terms, press  [Option], and select Edit, then press  [OK].
5. To add terms, press  [Add], then write a term and press  [Save] key.
6. To delete terms, press **Option**, then press **Delete** or **Delete All**.



You can activate or cancel the function such as call divert, call settings; in addition, you can check the cost and the duration of calls.

### Call register [Menu 2-1]

You can check the record of missed, received, and dialled calls. In the options of missed calls, received calls, and dialled numbers you can check:

- You can call by this number.
- You can save the number in the phonebook.
- You can view the date and the time of the call.
- You can send SMS, MMS, and e-mail to the recorded number.
- You can delete the record.

### Missed calls

This menu shows recently missed numbers. You can call these numbers, save and view date and time in this menu.

### Received calls

This menu shows recently received numbers. You can call these numbers, save and view date and time.

### Dialled calls

This menu shows recently dialed numbers. You can call these numbers, save and view date and time.




### All calls

You can save the phone number and check the date, time for a call. Or, you can call back to the other party.

### Call divert [Menu 2-2]

The Call divert service allows you to divert incoming voice calls, fax calls, and data calls to another number.

For details, contact your service provider.

1. Press  [Menu] in standby mode.
2. **Select Call** and **Call divert** menu.

### All voice calls

Diverts voice calls unconditionally.

### If busy

Diverts voice calls when the phone is in use.

### if no reply

Diverts voice calls which you do not answer.

### If out of reach

Diverts voice calls when the phone is switched off or out of coverage.



### All fax calls

Diverts to a number with a fax connection unconditionally.

### All data calls

Diverts to a number with a PC connection unconditionally.

#### • The submenus

Call divert menus have the submenus as shown below.

#### • On

Activates the corresponding service.

##### - To Voicemail box

Forwards to message centre. This function doesn't include All data calls and All fax calls menus.

##### - To a phone

Input the number for diverting.

#### • Off

Deactivates the corresponding service.

#### • View status

Checks the Status of the corresponding service.




### Call duration [Menu 2-3]

This function allows you to view the duration of incoming and outgoing calls. You can clear the duration record by using Reset key after entering the security code.


#### Last call

You need to input Security code to delete it.


#### All calls

If you press  [Reset], you can delete the duration of Last call, received call, and outgoing call. You need to input Security code.

#### Received calls

If you press  [Reset], you can delete Received call duration. You need to input Security code.

#### Dialled calls

If you press  [Reset], you can delete outgoing call duration. You need to input Security code.





## **Call costs [Menu 2-4]**

This network service allows you to check the cost of your last call and all call costs. To clear the counters, you need the PIN2 Code. You can set the cost limit by pressing **On**.

### **Last call**

This function allows you to reset the last call costs. You need to input the PIN2 code.

### **All calls**

This function allows you to reset the all call costs. You need to input PIN2 code.

### **Cost settings**

Changes the conditions to show call costs. Input PIN2 to set the conditions of call cost.

- **Set call cost**

The phone can show the call cost limits in terms of charging units or the desired currency. Contact your service provider for charging unit prices.

- **Set limit**

This network service allows you to limit the costs of your calls to a selected number of charging units.

## Call [Menu 2]



### Menu functions

#### - On

If you have selected **On**, the number of remaining units is shown. You can make and receive charged calls as long as the specified cost limit is not exceeded. You can set the cost limit by pressing **On**.


#### - Off

If you have selected **Off**, Call cost limit is canceled.

### ! REFERENCE

- The actual cost invoiced for calls by your service provider may vary depending upon network features, rounding-off for billing, tax, etc.

Shows bytes of all sent GPRS data.



## Settings [Menu 2-6]

You can set the menu relevant to a call by pressing [OK] in this menu.

### Call waiting

If this service is enabled, you can accept a waiting (incoming) call.

- **Activate**  
Activating the corresponding service.
- **Cancel**  
Deactivates the corresponding service.
- **View status**  
Checks the status of the service.

### Send my number

**(network and subscription dependent)**

You can send your phone number to the other party dependent on setting this function.

- **Set by network**  
If you select this, you can send your phone number depending on two line service such as line 1 or line 2.
- **On**  
If you select this, you can send your phone number to the other party. That is, your phone number will be displayed on receiver's phone.



### • Off

If you select this, your phone number will not be displayed on receiver's phone.

### Call reject

You can set or cancel the list to reject an incoming call.

1. If you select **Deactivate** and press [OK], the lists existed are canceled.
2. If you select **Reject on list** and press [Setup], you can see the lists. Press [Add] to input a phone number you want to reject.
3. You can set all the numbers stored in your phone if you select **Reject all** and press [OK].

### Auto response

If you can't answer a call, you can set **Auto response** after a set number rings.

1. You can set ON/ OFF by pressing , key.
2. You can select one of **Normal**, **Driving**, **User mode** or **Headset mode** by pressing , key.
3. After selecting a mode, press [OK] key.
4. If you want to change or listen the three modes in advance, press [Option] and select **Listen** or **Record**.



## Hold on

You can hold a call temporarily, and then activate answer message.

1. You can set Activate/ Deactivate by pressing (Ⓜ , Ⓜ) key.
2. You can select one of Normal, or User mode by pressing (Ⓜ , Ⓜ) key.
3. After selecting a mode, press (OK) [OK] key.
4. If you want to change or listen the three modes in advance, press (☞) [Option] and select **Listen**, **Record** or **Delete**.

## Auto redial

### • On

When this function is activated, the phone will automatically try to redial in the case of failure to connect a call.

### • Off

Your phone will not make any attempts to redial when the original call has not connected.

## Answer mode

### • Send key

If you select this menu, you can only answer incoming calls by pressing the (☞) key.

### • On flip open

If you select this menu, you can receive an incoming call by opening folder. If the folder already is open, you can answer the call by pressing any key except (Ⓜ) [End] and (☞) [Reject] key.

## Minute minder

If you select **On**, you will hear a beep for every completed minute while the call is active.



Camera, movie camera, image gallery and play video functions.

## Camcorder [Menu 3-2]

1. Select **Camcorder**, then press [OK] button.
2. Focus on the subject you want to capture from the Camera Standby Mode, then press [Rec.] button. Time available for filming the movie is denoted in the lower portion of the display. To save the movie after filming, press [Save] button.
3. Press [Player] button to view the filmed movie.

### REFERENCE

- Filming automatically stops when the movie camera capacity is exceeded.

## Image gallery [Menu 3-3]




Shows the images set or saved in Image gallery. Select **Image gallery** from the Multimedia Menu, then press [OK] button.

### Viewing Magnified Image



1. Select the small image you intend to view by using , , , and , then press [View] button.
2. Image title will appear in the title line of the display and the magnified image will show.
3. Use or from the Magnified Image Display to view the next or previous image.






### Deleting Image

## Media player [Menu 3-4]

Play video files, delete, and rename functions.



MPEG-4 video files are supported. Select **Media player** from the **Multimedia** menu, then press  [OK] button.

### Play Video

1. Select the video file you want to play from the Video File List, then press  [Play] button.
2. Playing Time is shown in the lower right portion of the display, allowing you to view the play in progress from the status bar.
3. Press  [||] to pause. To continue playing, press  [▶] button to resume playing from the current position.

### Home [Menu 4-1]

You can connect the homepage of the activated profile.

### Bookmarks [Menu 4-2]

Scroll to the required bookmark and press  [Option] key to operate the following options.

- **Edit** : Edits the title and address of bookmark.
- **Delete** : Deletes the selected bookmark.
- **Delete all**: Deletes all bookmarks.
- **Add** : Saves a new bookmark manually.

- If any bookmarks are not saved, only the “Add new” menu is available.

## **Settings [Menu 4-3]**

You have to set the following items before connecting the internet.  
You can make up to 9 profiles.

### **Homepage**

This setting allows you to enter the address (URL) of a site you want to use as homepage. You do not need to type “http://” at the front of each URL the WAP Browser will automatically add it.

### **IP address**

Input the IP address and the gateway which you want to connect to.

### **Connection mode**

Allows you to select Connection Oriented or Connectionless.

### **Security**

This option can be set None or Secure depending on the gateway. If you want to connect Secure, select Secure. If not, select None. The gateway should support this option.



### Idle Time out

By setting the time limit (10~600 sec.), the service will be disconnected if there is no data transfer.

### Bearer

#### • GPRS

**APN** : Input the Access point name to connect to the external network.

**User ID & Password** : Input User ID and password to connect to the gateway.

#### • CSD

**Dial number** : Input the number to connect the gateway.

**User ID & Password** : Input User ID and password to connect to the gateway.

**Baud rate** : Select the baud rate, 14400 bps or 9600 bps.

**Call type** : Select ISDN or Analogue.

### Go to URL [Menu 4-4]

You can move to the site that you want. You need to type the URL address of the site before connection.

### Clear cache [Menu 4-5]

The contents of Cache memory will be cleared.



- **Ring tone Download**

You can download up to 10 Ring tones directly through the WAP service if supported. The last ring tone is deleted when downloaded ringtones are more than 10. You can use them in **Profile** menu.

When you download Ringtone, the phone asks whether you play it.

1. If you select [Play], the phone plays the ring tone, you will be asked whether you want to save it.
2. If you don't select [Play], you will be asked whether you want to save the ringtone. If not, the ringtone is deleted.










### Phone book [Menu 5-1]

1. Select To Do from the To Do List, then press  [Option] key.
2. **Delete** : Deletes the selected note
3. **Delete All** : Deletes all the notes.
4. **Done/Not yet** : Shows whether the task is done. If the task is not **Done**, an arrow will appear on the note. If the task is done, **Not yet** is shown. If you select Not yet, the arrow will disappear.
5. **View calendar** : Shows the current month calendar.

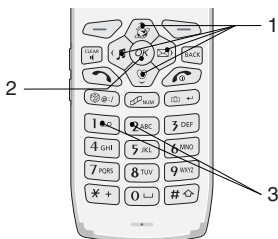
