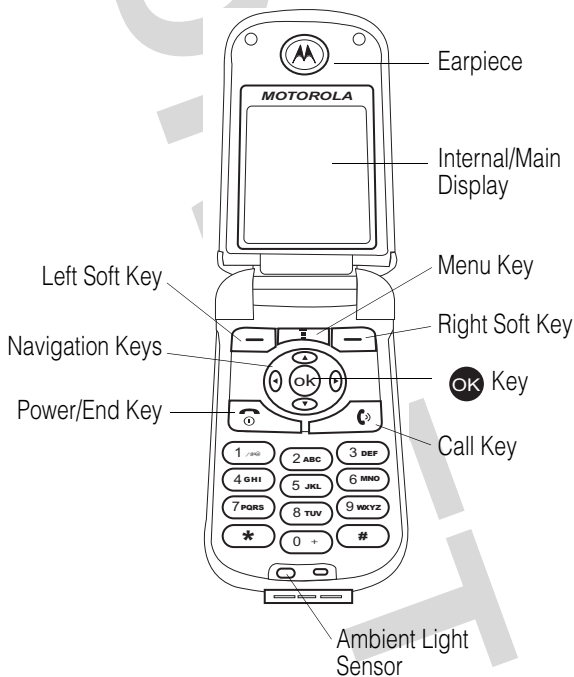

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# ***Safety and General Information***

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IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON SAFE AND EFFICIENT OPERATION.  
READ THIS INFORMATION BEFORE USING YOUR PHONE.

The information provided in this document supersedes the general safety information in user guides published prior to December 1, 2002.

## ***Exposure To Radio Frequency (RF) Energy***

Your phone contains a transmitter and a receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your phone transmits.

Your Motorola phone is designed to comply with local regulatory requirements in your country concerning exposure of human beings to RF energy.

## ***Operational Precautions***

To assure optimal phone performance and make sure human exposure to RF energy is within the guidelines set forth in the relevant standards, always adhere to the following procedures.

### ***External Antenna Care***

Use only the supplied or Motorola-approved replacement antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could damage the phone.

Do NOT hold the external antenna when the phone is IN USE. Holding the external antenna affects call quality and may cause the phone to operate at a higher power level than needed. In addition, use of unauthorized antennas may result in non-compliance with the local regulatory requirements in your country.

## ***Phone Operation***

When placing or receiving a phone call, hold your phone as you would a wireline telephone.

## ***Body-Worn Operation***

To maintain compliance with RF energy exposure guidelines, if you wear a phone on your body when transmitting, always place the phone in a Motorola-supplied or approved clip, holder, holster, case, or body harness for this phone, if available. Use of accessories not approved by Motorola may exceed RF energy exposure guidelines. If you do not use one of the body-worn accessories approved or supplied by Motorola, and are not using the phone held in the normal use position, ensure the phone and its antenna are at least 1 inch (2.5 centimeters) from your body when transmitting.

## ***Data Operation***

When using any data feature of the phone, with or without an accessory cable, position the phone and its antenna at least 1 inch (2.5 centimeters) from your body.

## ***Approved Accessories***

Use of accessories not approved by Motorola, including but not limited to batteries and antenna, may cause your phone to exceed RF energy exposure guidelines. For a list of approved Motorola accessories, visit our website at [www.Motorola.com](http://www.Motorola.com).

## ***RF Energy Interference/Compatibility***

**Note:** Nearly every electronic device is susceptible to RF energy interference from external sources if inadequately shielded, designed, or otherwise configured for RF energy compatibility. In some circumstances your phone may cause interference.

## ***Facilities***

Turn off your phone in any facility where posted notices instruct you to do so. These facilities may include hospitals or health care facilities that may be using equipment that is sensitive to external RF energy.



## ***Aircraft***

When instructed to do so, turn off your phone when on board an aircraft. Any use of a phone must be in accordance with applicable regulations per airline crew instructions.

## ***Medical Devices***

### **Pacemakers**

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 6 inches (15 centimeters) be maintained between a handheld wireless phone and a pacemaker.

Persons with pacemakers should:

- ALWAYS keep the phone more than 6 inches (15 centimeters) from your pacemaker when the phone is turned ON.
- NOT carry the phone in the breast pocket.
- Use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize the potential for interference.
- Turn OFF the phone immediately if you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place.

### **Hearing Aids**

Some digital wireless phones may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

### **Other Medical Devices**

If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information.

## ***Use While Driving***

Check the laws and regulations on the use of phones in the area where you drive. Always obey them.

When using your phone while driving, please:

- Give full attention to driving and to the road.
- Use hands-free operation, if available.
- Pull off the road and park before making or answering a call if driving conditions so require.

## ***Operational Warnings***

### ***For Vehicles With an Air Bag***

Do not place a phone in the area over an air bag or in the air bag deployment area. Air bags inflate with great force. If a phone is placed in the air bag deployment area and the air bag inflates, the phone may be propelled with great force and cause serious injury to occupants of the vehicle.

### ***Potentially Explosive Atmospheres***

Turn off your phone prior to entering any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere, unless it is a phone type especially qualified for use in such areas and certified as “Intrinsically Safe.” Do not remove, install, or charge batteries in such areas. Sparks in a potentially explosive atmosphere can cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death.

**Note:** The areas with potentially explosive atmospheres referred to above include fueling areas such as below decks on boats, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities, areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders. Areas with potentially explosive atmospheres are often but not always posted.

### ***Blasting Caps and Areas***






To avoid possible interference with blasting operations, turn OFF your phone when you are near electrical blasting caps, in a blasting area, or in

areas posted “Turn off electronic devices.” Obey all signs and instructions.

## **Batteries**

Batteries can cause property damage and/or bodily injury such as burns if a conductive material such as jewelry, keys, or beaded chains touch exposed terminals. The conductive material may complete an electrical circuit (short circuit) and become quite hot. Exercise care in handling any charged battery, particularly when placing it inside a pocket, purse, or other container with metal objects. **Use only Motorola original batteries and chargers.**

Your battery or phone may contain symbols, defined as follows:

Symbol	Definition
	Important safety information will follow.
	Your battery or phone should not be disposed of in a fire.
	Your battery or phone may require recycling in accordance with local laws. Contact your local regulatory authorities for more information.
	Your battery or phone should not be thrown in the trash.
	Your phone contains an internal lithium ion battery.

## **Seizures/Blackouts**

Some people may be susceptible to epileptic seizures or blackouts when exposed to blinking lights, such as when watching television or playing video games. These seizures or blackouts may occur even if a person never had a previous seizure or blackout.

If you have experienced seizures or blackouts, or if you have a family history of such occurrences, please consult with your doctor before

playing video games on your phone or enabling a blinking-lights feature on your phone. (The blinking-light feature is not available on all products.)

Parents should monitor their children's use of video game or other features that incorporate blinking lights on the phones. All persons should discontinue use and consult a doctor if any of the following symptoms occur: convulsion, eye or muscle twitching, loss of awareness, involuntary movements, or disorientation.

To limit the likelihood of such symptoms, please take the following safety precautions:

- Do not play or use a blinking-lights feature if you are tired or need sleep.
- Take a minimum of a 15-minute break hourly.
- Play in a room in which all lights are on.
- Play at the farthest distance possible from the screen.

## ***Repetitive Motion Injuries***

When you play games on your phone, you may experience occasional discomfort in your hands, arms, shoulders, neck, or other parts of your body. Follow these instructions to avoid problems such as tendonitis, carpal tunnel syndrome, or other musculoskeletal disorders:

- Take a minimum 15-minute break every hour of game playing.
- If your hands, wrists, or arms become tired or sore while playing, stop and rest for several hours before playing again.
- If you continue to have sore hands, wrists, or arms during or after play, stop playing and see a doctor.

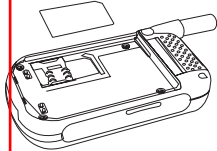
## Installing the SIM Card

Your Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card contains your phone number, service details, and phonebook/message information.

**Caution:** Do not bend or scratch your SIM card. Avoid exposing your SIM card to static electricity, water, or dirt.

### Action

With your phone facing down, fit the SIM card into the slot, with the metal contacts facing down and the beveled corner pointed at the notch of the slot (as shown).



## Installing the Battery

You must install and charge the battery to use your phone.



Your phone is designed to use only Motorola Original batteries and accessories. We recommend that you store batteries in their protective cases when not in use.

### Action

- 1 Remove the battery from the plastic case.
- 2 Insert the battery with the 2 tabs wedged into the battery slots.



## Action

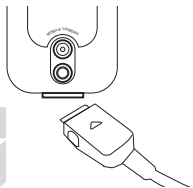
- 3 Latch the other end of battery door so that it clicks into place.

## Charging the Battery

New batteries are partially charged. Before using your phone, charge the battery as described below. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

## Action


- 1 With your phone facing up, plug in the travel charger, with the LED facing up.



- 2 Plug the other end into the appropriate electrical outlet. The LED turns green when the battery is being charged.
- 3 When done charging, unplug the charger from the outlet, and press the release tabs to remove the charger from your phone.

When you charge the battery, the battery power level indicator in the external and internal displays shows how much of the charging process is complete. At least 1 segment of the battery power level indicator must be visible to ensure full phone functionality while charging.





When the battery power is low, your phone will play the warning tones to warn you. Charge the battery immediately (see page 23).




If battery power runs out, your phone turns off.

## Battery Use

To maximize your battery's performance:

- Always use Motorola Original™ batteries and battery chargers. The phone warranty does not cover damage caused from using non-Motorola batteries and/or battery chargers.



New batteries or batteries that have been stored for a long time may require a longer charge time. When charging, displays the charging status in 10-20 minutes.

- Maintain the battery at or near room temperature when charging.
- Do not expose batteries to temperatures below  $-10^{\circ}\text{C}$  ( $14^{\circ}\text{F}$ ) or above  $45^{\circ}\text{C}$  ( $113^{\circ}\text{F}$ ). Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.
- When you do not intend to use a battery for a while, store it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place, such as a refrigerator.
- Over time, batteries gradually wear down and require longer charging times. This is normal. If you charge your battery regularly and notice a decrease in talk time or an increase in charging time, then it is probably time to buy a new battery.







The rechargeable batteries that power this phone must be disposed of properly and may need to be recycled. Contact your local recycling center for proper disposal methods. Never dispose of batteries in a fire because they may explode. Refer to your battery's label for battery type.




## Turning On Your Phone

### Action



- 1 Open your phone's flip.
- 2 Press and hold  to turn on the phone.
- 3 If necessary, enter your SIM card PIN code and press  to unlock the SIM card.


**Caution:** If you enter an incorrect PIN code 3 times in a row, your phone disables the SIM card and displays **SIM Blocked**.

- 4 If necessary, enter your 4-digit unlock code and press  to unlock the phone.



**Note:** The unlock code is originally set to 1234. Your service provider may change this number before you receive your phone.


- 5 Enter the current time (*HH:MM*) and press  to confirm.
- 6 Enter the current date (*YYYY/MM/DD*) and press  to confirm.

**Tip:** To reset the time and date, press  > **Settings** > **Clock** > **Set the time** and **Set the date**.)



Your phone starts to connect to your service provider and then enters the idle display if connection is successfully established.

## Adjusting the In-Call Volume

	Press	To
1	up in-call volume key  or  down in-call volume key	increase earpiece volume during a call  decrease earpiece volume during a call
2		save the setting

**Note:** Adjust the in-call volume from the idle display.

## Displaying Your Phone Number








**Tip:** Press and hold  to insert a “P” (pause character) and then enter an extension following it.

**Tip:** Press and hold  to insert a “+” and then enter the country code, area code (omitting the starting 0), and phone number to make an international call.


**Note:** Dial the phone number from the idle display.

# Answering a Call

When you receive a call, your phone rings and/or vibrates and displays an incoming call message.

Press	To
1 	answer the call
2 	end the call



**Tip:** When **Flip answer** is active, open the phone to answer the call. (To activate, press  > **Settings** > **Call feature**




> **Flip answer.**)

**Tip:** When **Anykey answer** is active, press any of the keys except  to answer the call. (To activate, press  > **Settings** > **Call feature** > **Anykey answer.**)

**Note:** If the phone is locked, you must unlock it to answer the call.

## Muting/Unmuting a Call

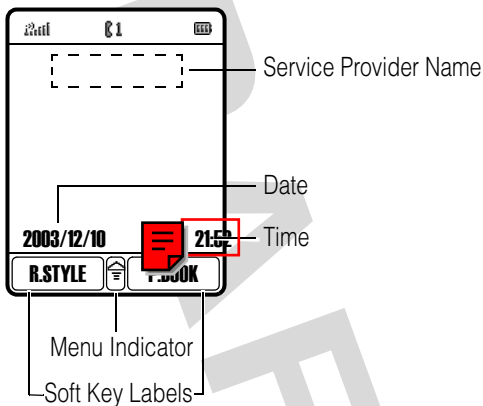
When you are on a call:

# Learning to Use Your Phone

## Using the Internal Display


The *idle display* is the standard display when you are *not* on a call or using the menu.







The Menu indicator indicates that you can press the menu key  to display the main or options menu.

Labels at the bottom corners show the current soft key functions. Press the left soft key  or right soft key  to perform the function indicated by the left or right soft key label.



Press  from the idle display to see 4 menu feature icons. You can also decide which 4 menu options you would like to see by setting the home keys (see page 102).

At the top of the display are the following status indicators:

Icon	Name	Description
	<b>Signal Strength</b>	Indicates strength of signal being received. The more vertical bars, the better the reception (5 bars maximum).  Bars differ in color by the signal strength: green > orange > red.
	<b>Battery Power Level</b>	Indicates remaining battery power. The more bars, the more battery power available (3 bars maximum).  Bars differ in color by power level: green > orange > red. The icon flashes when battery power is near empty.
	<b>New Text Message</b>	Indicates new unread message(s).
	<b>New Text/Voicemail Message</b>	Indicates new unread/unheard message(s).



Icon	Name	Description
	<b>New Voicemail Message</b>	Indicates new unheard voicemail message(s).
	<b>Roaming</b>	Indicates you are on another network.
	<b>Line 1/Line 2</b>	Indicates telephone line you are using.
	<b>Vibrator On</b>	Indicates vibrator is turned on.
	<b>Silent</b>	Indicates ringer is turned off.
	<b>GPRS Mode</b>	Indicates you are on the GPRS network.
	<b>Call Connected</b>	Indicates you are on a call.
	<b>OICQ Mode</b>	Indicates you are using OICQ.

## Using Menus



From the idle display, press to display the main menu.

### Selecting a Menu Feature

To select a menu feature, starting from the idle display:

#### Find the Feature


> Phonebook  
> Add

Use  to scroll, and the left/right soft keys to select the soft key functions listed in the bottom left and right corners of the display. 

**Note:** In this user's guide, "Find the Feature" always indicates the feature's position in the icon menu.



## **Selecting a Feature Option**

Some features require you to select an item from a list:

- Press  to scroll up or down to highlight the item.
- In a numbered list, press an alphanumeric key to highlight the item.
- In an alphabetized list, press a key multiple times to cycle through the letters on the key and highlight the closest matching list item.

## **Entering Feature Information**

Some features require you to enter information:

- Enter numbers or text with alphanumeric keys.
-  When an item has a list of possible numeric values, press an alphanumeric key to set the value.
- If you enter or edit information and do not want to save changes, press  to exit without saving.

**Phonebook** lets you create phonebook entries. A *flashing cursor* shows where text is entered.







# Entering Text

Multiple text entry modes make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages on your phone.

**Note:** The text entry mode you select remains active until you change it by selecting another mode.

## Using Tap Mode

Tap mode is the standard mode for entering text on your phone.

Press  > **Input mode** from any text entry screen and select **Tap mode**.

	Press	To
1	keypad key 1 or more times	select letter, number, or symbol
2	keypad keys	enter remaining characters
3		store text

### General Text Entry Rules

Press a key repeatedly to cycle through its characters.

- If you do not press a key for 2 seconds, the highlighted character highlighted is accepted, and the cursor moves to the next position.
- The 1st character of every sentence is capitalized. After entering 3 characters of a word, you will be presented with a possible word combination. Scroll right to select this word, or scroll up and select another word from the list.

## Setting Words to Complete Automatically




**Word completion** allows you to select a word from a list after you enter the 1st 3 characters.

> **Word completion** > **ON**

## Use iTAP™ Software Predictive Text Entry Mode




iTAP™ English is a predictive text entry mode that lets you enter a word using 1 key press per letter.

Press  > **Input mode** from any text entry screen, and select **iTAP English**.



## Entering Words




Press	To
1 an keypad key	enter the 1st letter of word <b>Tip:</b> The letters associated with the key are shown at the bottom of the display.
2 keypad keys (1 per letter)	enter rest of word <b>Tip:</b> Alternative words and letter combinations are shown at the bottom of the display. The word choices update with each key press.
3 	highlight word you want
4 	enter word at flashing cursor location <b>Tip:</b> iTAP automatically inserts a space after each word.

For example, to spell the word “art,”  
press    . The display shows **art**.

## Entering Novel Words

If you enter a word that iTAP does not recognize, the word does not display.

### Action

- 1 Press **CLEAR**  1 or more times to delete letters until a letter combination matches the start of the word.
- 2 Press  to highlight letter or letter combination.
- 3 Press **OK** , then scroll left to move cursor to the left and “lock” the selected word portion.
- 4 Continue to enter letters and highlight letter combinations to spell the word.

Your phone stores the unrecognized word and includes it in the list of alternative word choices. When memory space for unrecognized words is filled, your phone deletes the oldest words as it adds new words.

## Entering Numbers

### Action

- 1 Enter the 1st digit, then highlight it to put the iTAP software in number entry mode.
- 2 Press keys to add digits to the number.
- 3 Press **OK** to enter the number at the flashing cursor location.



### Deleting Letters and Words


With the cursor to the right of the text you want to delete:



### Action

Press **CLEAR**  to delete 1 letter at a time.

Press and hold **CLEAR**  to delete the entire line.

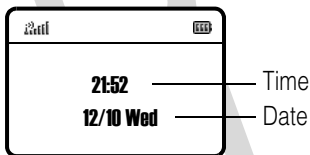
### Using Symbol Text Entry Mode

Your phone provides an alternate way to enter symbol characters. Press  > **Input mode** from any text entry screen and select **Symbol**.

	Press	To
1		highlight desired symbol
2		enter symbol at flashing cursor location

# Using the External Display



The external display shows the phone status, including network signal and battery power level. Press the in-call volume key to show time and date. Press the in-call volume key again to show the phone status only.




You can also set a clock type:

## Find the Feature

 > **Settings** > **External display**  
> **Clock type**

Press	To
1 	scroll to the desired clock type
2 	select the clock type

When you receive an incoming call, the external display shows the caller's number or name. To answer the incoming call, open the flip.

**Note:** To see a caller's name in the external display, the caller's number must match an entry in your phonebook (see page [66](#)). 



# Locking and Unlocking Your Phone


You can lock your phone manually or set the phone to lock automatically whenever you turn it off. To use a locked phone, you must enter the unlock code. A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, *but you must unlock it to answer.*


You can make emergency calls on your phone even when it is locked.

## Locking Your Phone Manually


### Find the Feature

> **Code status** > **Phone lock**  
> **Lock now**

	Press	To
1	keypad keys	enter your unlock code
2		lock the phone

 **Tip:** Your phone's unlock code is originally set to 1234 at the factory. Your service provider may reset the unlock code to the last 4 digits of your phone number.

| <b>SIM lock</b>   | Lock your phone when you insert an unidentified SIM card.   |

 Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is factory-set to 1234, and the 6-digit SIM card code is factory-set to 000000. Your service provider may reset these before you receive your phone.

## ***Specific Absorption Rate Data***

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**This model phone meets the international standards for exposure to radio waves.**

Your mobile phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The guidelines include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. Under the guidelines for your phone model, the SAR limit is 2.0 W/kg.<sup>1</sup> Tests for SAR are conducted in accordance with CENELEC<sup>2</sup> testing procedures using standard operating positions with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a base station, the lower the power output of the phone.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, it is tested to confirm compliance with the guidelines. The tests are performed in positions that conform to a uniform testing methodology determined by an expert standards body. The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested for use at the ear is  W/kg.<sup>3</sup> 

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure. Please note that improvements to this

product model could cause differences in the SAR value for later products; in all cases, products are designed to be within the guidelines.
