What is WAP?

(A)

WAP (Wireless Application Protocol) is the gateway to a new world of mobile data. It provides a universal standard, enabling you to access web-based interactive information services and applications directly from your mobile phone.

About the WAP Browser

Your phone comes equipped with a WAP (Wireless Application Protocol) browser, making it possible for you to access the wireless web

The WAP browser allows you to:

- Access up-to-the-minute information via your phone.
- View specially designed text versions of popular Internet sites including Yahoo![®], CNN MobileSM and the Weather Channel[®].

Browsing the wireless web using your phone is unlike using your computer, in that site providers have:

- Selected only the critical aspects of their site for wireless phone users.
- Removed most graphics.

Each time you start the WAP Browser, the phone connects to the Wireless Web and the service indicator icon () appears on the display to inform you that you are:

- Connected to the Wireless Web.
- Will be billed accordingly. The rates vary according to your service option.

The WAP browser ends the network connection after a certain period of inactivity and automatically reconnects as necessary. For this reason, you may find that you are billed for several network connections within a single session. This is normal and is designed to minimise your bill.


Configuring the WAP Browser

Before using the WAP browser, you must set the parameters for the proxy server used by your service provider.

Accessing the WAP Browser

To access the WAP Browser menu:

 When the idle screen is displayed, press the Menu soft key.



 Press the — or — key until the Fun Box menu option is highlighted, and press the Select soft key. You can also press the 7 key directly.



3. Press the — or — key to highlight **WAP Browser** then press the **Select** soft key. You can also press the **2** key directly.

 Press the — or — key one or more times to highlight the required option and then press the Select soft key.

Option	Description
Home	Connects the phone to the network and loads the homepage of the wireless web service provider.
Favorite	Allows you to store the URL addresses of your favourite Web sites. To store a URL address, select an empty location and press the Options soft key. Enter the address, and then a name.

Option	Description
Favorite (continued)	 After storing, three options are available. Goto URL: access the site quickly. Edit: edits the selected address. Erase: deletes the selected address.
	You can access this menu and directly by pressing and holding the # key down in the WAP browser.
http://	Allows you to enter manually the URL address of the Web site that you wish to access. You can access this menu directly by pressing and holding the \star key down in the WAP browser.
Settings	Allows you to set up five proxy servers for the WAP browser.
Clear Cache	Clears the information stored in the phone's temporary memory which stores the most recently accessed web pages.

Configuring the WAP Browser

To configure the WAP browser:

- In the WAP Browser menu, highlight Settings using the — and — keys, then press the Select soft key. You can also press the 4 key directly.
- 2. Select a proxy server and press the **Select** soft key. Contact your service provider for details.

Parameter	Description
Profile Name	Name of the HTTP proxy server.
Homepage URL	Address of your startup homepage. When the default homepage is displayed, you can delete it using the C key and enter your own choice.
Security	Data transmission mode: Choose Secure to protect your data against unauthorised access, or choose Non-Secure .
IP Address	IP address required to connect to the Internet.
Login Name	PPP server login ID.
Password	PPP server password.
Dial-up Number	PPP server phone number.
Data Call Type	Data call type: Analogue or ISDN.

- **Note**: The WAP browser settings may vary, depending on the service provider. Contact your service provider for further information.
- 3. After selecting each of these settings, a screen appears where you can either enter the information required or choose between given options. When you are satisfied with your text input or selection, press the **OK** soft key.
- When you finish configuring the WAP browser, press the m∖⊕ key or the right soft key.

Getting Started

Starting the WAP Browser

To start the WAP browser when the idle screen is displayed, press the \vec{z} key or press the **Menu** soft key, followed by the keys **7**, **2** and **1**.

A connection is established with your service provider and the corresponding homepage is displayed.

The contents of the WAP browser startup homepage depends on your Wireless Web service provider. To scroll through the screen, use the - and - keys.

Note: To access the startup homepage from any other screen in the WAP browser, use the **Home** option. For more information about the WAP browser menus, refer to page 13.

Exiting the WAP Browser

To exit the browser at any time, simply press the $\ensuremath{\frown}_{\mathbb{Q}}$ key.

Using the WAP Browser

Using the Soft Keys

A bar containing browser commands is located at the bottom of the WAP browser display. The soft keys below the bar are used to execute these commands. The two keys are called soft keys because their function changes depending on the WAP browser application in use.

Navigating the WAP Browser

То	Then
Scroll through and select browser items	Press — and — keys until the required item is highlighted, and then press the left soft key to confirm the selection.
Select a numbered item	Press the corresponding numeric key.
Return to the previous page	Press the Back soft key or the C key.
Return to the startup homepage	Select the Home menu option; for more information about this option, refer to page 13.

Entering Text, Numbers or Symbols

When you are prompted to enter text, the current text entry mode is indicated on the screen. The following modes are available:

SYM: Allows you to enter various symbols and punctuation marks. To scan through the symbol list, use the navigation keys. When the desired symbol is selected, press the left soft key.

123: Allows you to enter numbers.

WORD: Allows you to enter words by pressing one key only per letter. Availability of this mode depends on your service provider. To access the WAP browser menu or startup homepage in this mode, press and hold down the **#** key.

ABC: Allows you to enter letters in the alphabet. Press the corresponding key until the required letter is displayed. You can change the case by pressing the # key.

- **ABC**: Initial capitalize. After entering a word, the case automatically changes to abc mode.
- **abc**: Lower case.
- +ALPHA: Upper case.

Change modes	Press the right soft key.
Enter a space	Press the) key.
Switch between upper and lower- case	Press the # key.
Edit text	 Set the cursor to the right of the character to be corrected. Press the C key as needed. Enter the correct character(s).

Using the WAP Browser Menus

Using and Selecting Menu Options

Various menu options are available when you are using the WAP browser to navigate the wireless web.

To access a menu option;

- Press the *i* key. A menu is displayed.
- 2. Highlight the required menu option by pressing the or key.
- 3. Select the option by pressing the left soft key.
- If necessary, select the secondary option using the — and — keys, and press the left soft key to confirm.
- **Note**: The menus may vary, depending on your version of the WAP browser.

Back

This option reloads the previous page in the history.

Home

This option takes you back at any time to the homepage of the wireless web service provider.



Exit

This option lets you exit the current browser.

Mark Site

You can set a bookmark for most pages; they can then be accessed directly from any web page. Bookmarks save you time by reducing the number of steps required to access a given page.

Select this option for any page that you wish to consult regularly.

Bookmarks

This option allows you to load a bookmarked Web page directly.

Select the required page in the bookmark list using the - and - keys, and then press the left soft key to go to the selected page.

Note: To use the Bookmark feature, you must first set a bookmark for the required page using the Mark Site option above.

Inbox

This option displays all of the web alerts.

Save Image

This option allows you to save the displayed image on the current page. You can see the saved image in **Pictures** of the **Downloads** menu option (**Menu 7.3**).

Reload

This option reloads the current page.

Settings

This option gives you access to the following setting features.

Homepage

With this feature, you can change the startup homepage manually.

Proxy

This option allows you to change the proxy server to the desired one without ending the current wap session establishment.

Circuit Prompt

This feature allows you to set the prompt confirming your selection to display each time you access a site without wap session establishment.

Select **ON** to display the confirming window, or **OFF** not to display.



Circuit Linger

This feature allows you to set how long the phone waits for before ending the attempt for connection when there is no answer from the network. It is preset to **30 sec**.

Scroll Mode

This feature lets you select the scroll mode between **Block** and **Smooth.** It is preset to the **Smooth** mode.

Scroll Speed

This feature allows you to set the speed for scrolling to the next screen. You can select **Fast, Medium,** and **Slow**. It is preset to **Medium**.

Key Press Timeout

This feature allows you to set how fast the phone recognises your selection with one keypress. You can select **Fast, Medium**, and **Slow**. It is preset to **Medium**.

Security

This feature displays all information about security, such as Connection Prompt, Current Certificate, CA Certificates, Private Key PIN, and Authentication.

The following options are available:

Connection Prompt: controls the display of the Connection Prompt, "Secure connection established" after a WTLS (Wireless Transport Layer Security) session has been established. Select \mathbf{ON} to display the connection prompt, or \mathbf{OFF} not to display.

Secure Prompt: controls the display of the Secure Prompt when you access or exit the secured page.

Select **ON** to display the secure prompt, or **OFF** not to display.

Current Certificate: displays whether this session was or not established using a certificate.

CA (Certificate Authority) Certificate: displays the information of WTLS. It provides for an enhanced level of security layer between the gateway and the client by providing for server authentication.

A certificate is a digital ID. It is issued by a trusted third party known as Certificate Authority. The phone uses CA certificates to authenticate web sites that send information to the phone.

Encryption: controls the key generating for the certificate. You can select **Verify Key** and **New Key**.

Selecting **Verify Key** displays the current key.

Select **New Key** to create new key generating. Perform this function only if instructed to do so by your service provider.

Advanced

This option gives you access to the following advanced features:

Show URL: This feature displays the URL address of the site to which you are currently connected. It also enables you to declare the current site as the startup homepage.



Restart Browser: If the browser is not functioning correctly, select this option to restart the browser without exiting it.

Offline Services: Most applications are stored on a server that cannot be accessed outside your wireless coverage area. However, some applications can be stored in the cache of your phone, enabling you to use them offline. You can remove the associated site from the cache at any time.

Note: If you attempt to save more than 15 sites, a message informs you that the first site in the list will be deleted to create space for the new site.

To delete a site from the offline services list:

- 1. Select the site using the and keys.
- 2. Press the **Erase** soft key.

Outbox: This advanced feature stores outgoing requests from the browser so that they can be processed at a later date.

This option provides you with information about the version of the Mobile Browser software and the WIM (WAP Identity Module).
