## Road safiety comes first

## Switch off when refuelling

Do not use the phone at a refuelling point (senice station) or near fuels or chericals.

## Switch off in aircraft

Mobile phones can cause interference. Using themon airaraft is both illegal and dangerous.

## Respectspecial regulations

Follow any spedial regulations in force in any area and al ways switch off your phone whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger (in a hospital for example).

## Interference

All mobile phones may be subject to radio interference, which may affect their performance.

## Unpacking

## Qualified senvice

Only qualified senvice personnel must repair cellular equipment. Use only approved accessories and batteries.

## Use sensibly

Use only in the nomral position (held to the ear). Avoid unnecessary contact with the antenna when the phone is switched on.

## Emergency calls

Ensure the phone is switched on and in service. Enter the emergency number ( 112 or another official errergency number) and press the key. Give your location. Do not end the call until given perrission to do so. End the call by dosing the flip cover or pressing the -a/(1) key.

IMPORTANT: Use only SAMSUNG-approved accessories.
The use of any other power accessory will invalidate any approval or warranty applying to the phone, and may be dangerous.

When you disconnect the power cord of any accessory, grasp and pull the connector, not the cord.

## Baddight

The display is illuminated by a baddight. When you press any key, the baddight illuminates. It tums off if no key is pressed within a given period of time, depending on the Backlight option set in the Phone Settings menu.

To specify the length of time for which the baddight is adive, set the Backlightmenu option (45); see page 74 for further details.

## Senvice Light:

The service light is in the top right-hand comer of the phone It flashes when services are available on the phone.

To adivate or deadivate use of the service light, set the Senvice Light menu option (46); see page 74 for further details.


## Getting Started

## Yaur First Call

The following diagramexplains the main steps required when making your first call and indicates the pages on which you can find more detailed instructions.


## Installing the SIM Gard

When you subscribe to a cellular network, you are provided with a plug-in SIM card loaded with your subscription details (PIN, optional services available and so on).

Important: The plug-in SIM card and its contacts can be easily damaged by scratches or bending, so be careful when handling, inserting or removing the card.

Keep all SIM cards out of the reach of small children.

1. If necessary, switch off the phone by hol ding down the - /(1) key until the Bye Bye message is displayed.
2. Remove the battery. To do so:
(1) Push up and hold the catch above the battery on the back of the phone
(2) Lift the battery away

3. Push the SIM card holder in the direction of the arrow and hold it in this position. Insert the SIM card under the two tabs on the left of the phone, ensuring that the cut comer is top left and the gold contacts of the card face into the phone

4. Hold the SIM card down and release the holder to lock it into place.

5. Insert the tabs on the base of the battery into the notches on the base of the phone, as shown, and push the battery down until you hear a didk.


## Cherging a Battery

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable Li-Ion battery. A travel adapter is provided with your phone. Use only approved batteries and chargers. Ask your local SAMSUNG dealer for further details.

The phone can be used while the battery is charging.
Note: You must fully charge the battery before using your phone for the first time. A discharged battery is fully recharged in approximately 200 minutes.

1. With the battery in position on the phone, connect the lead from the travel adapter to the bottom of the phone

2. Connect the adapter to a standard $A C$ wall outlet.
3. When charging is finished, disconnect the adapter fromthe power outlet and fromthe phone.


## Low Bittery Incicatior

When the battery is weak and only a few minutes of talk time remain, you will hear a waming tone and a message will be repeated at regular intervals on the display:


When the battery becomes too weak for the phone to operate, it switches off automatically.

## Switching the Phone Onf Off

1. Open the flip cover.
2. Hold down the $\mathbf{S} /$ (Dey for more than one second to switch the phone on.
3. If the phone asks for a password, key in the password and press the OK soft key. The phone password is factory set to 0000000 . For futher details, see page 20.
4. If the phone asks for a PIN, key in the PIN and press the OK soft key. For futher details, see page 21.
The phone searches for your network and when it finds it, the ide screen, illustrated below, is displayed

Note: The display language is factory set to English. To change the language, use the Language menu option (44); for further details, refer to page 74.
5. When you wish to switch the phone off, hold down the $\boldsymbol{A} / \mathbb{C}$ button for more than two seconds.

## Acress Codes

There are several access codes that are used by your phone and its SIM card. These codes help you protect the phone against unauthorised use.
When requested for any of the codes explained below, key in the appropriate code (displayed as asterisks) and press the OK soft key. If you make a mistake, press the $C$ key one or more times until the incorrect digit is deared and then continue entering the correct code.

The access codes (except for the PUK and PUK2 codes) can be changed using Security menu options. See page 86 for further details.

Important Avoid using access codes resembling emergency numbers, such as 112 , so that you do not dial an emergency number accidentally.

## Phone Passuard

The Phone Lock feature uses the phone password to protect your phone against unauthorised use. The phone password is supplied with the phone and is factory set to 00000000.

Change the phone password 88 (menu option 64).

## PIN

The Personal Identification Number or PIN (4 to 8 digits) proteds your SIM card against unauthorised use. It is usually supplied with the SIM card.

If you enter an incorrect PIN three times in succession, the code is disabled and cannot be used until you re-enable it by entering the PUK (see below).

PUK

The 8-digit PUK (Personal Undodking Key) is required to change a disabled PIN. The PUK may be supplied with the SIM card. If not, or you have lost it, contact your senvice provider.

To re-enable your PIN, proceed as follows.

1. Key in the PUK and press the OK soft key.
2. Enter a new PIN of your choice and press the OK soft key.
3. When the ConfirmNew PIN message is displayed, key in the same code again and press the OKsoft key.

If you enter an incorrect PUKten times in succession, the SIM card becomes invalid. Contact your senvice provider for a new card.

## PIND

The PIN2 (4 to 8 digits), supplied with some SIM cards, is required to access specific fundions, such as setting the maximumcost of a call. These fundions are available if supported by your SIM card.

If you enter an incorrect PIN2 three times in succession, the code is disabled and you cannot access the fundions until you re-enable it by entering the PUKZ.

To change the PIN2, refer to page 89 (menu option 67).

## PUR

The 8-digit PUK2 (Personal Unblodking Key 2), supplied with some SIM cards, is required to change a disabled PIN2. If you lose the code, contad your senvice provider.

To re-enable your PIN2, proceed as follows.

1. Key in the PUK2 and press the OK soft key.
2. Enter a new PIN2 of your choice and press the OKsoft key.
3. When the ConfimmPIN2 message is displayed, key in the same code again and press the OKsoft key.

If you enter an incorrect PUK2 ten times in succession, you will not be able to access the fundions requiring the PIN2. Contact your senvice provider for a new card.

## Barring Passward

The 4-digit barring password is required when you use the Call Barring fundion You obtain the password fromyour senvice provider when you subsaribe to this fundion. See page 92 for further details.

## Malking a Call

When the id e screen is displayed, key in the area code and phone number and press the key.

Noter If you have set the Auto Redial menu option (47) to $\mathbf{O N}$ (see page 75 ) and the person called does not answer or is already on the phone, the number is redialled automatically up to ten times.

## Making Internetional Calls

1. Press and hold down the Okey.

## Redialling the Last Number

The phone stores the last 10 numbers dialled. To recall any of these numbers, proceed as follows.

1. If you have typed any characters on the display, dear the display by hol ding down the $\mathbf{C}$ key for more than one second.
2. Press the keyto display the last number dialled.
3. Use the $\mathbf{V}$ and $\boldsymbol{\wedge}$ keys to scroll through the numbers until the required number is displayed.

## Acjusting the Volume

During a call, if you want to adjust the earpiece volume, use the $\quad$, and keys on the left side of the phone. Press ", to increase and to decrease the volume


In idle mode with the flip open, you can adjust the key volume using the " and keys on the left side of the phone

## Anbweringa Call

When somebody calls you, the phone rings and the phone icon in the middle of the screen flashes.


If the caller can be identified, the caller's phone number (or name if stored in your phonebook) is displayed. If the caller cannot be identified, only the phone icon flashes.

1. If necessary, open the flip.

Press the key or the Accept soft key to answer the incoming call.

## Notes:

- To reject an incoming call, press the Rejectsoft key.
- If the Active Fipmenu option (49) is set to Enalole, you do not need to press any key. You can answer the call simply by opening the flip (see page 75 ).

2. End the call by dosing the phone or pressing the
-4/(1) key.
Note: You can answer a call while using the phonebook or menu features.

## Vieving Missed Calls

If you are unable to answer a call for any reason, you can find out who was calling you, provided that this senvice is available. In this way, you can call the person badk, if necessary.

The number of missed calls is displayed on the idle screen immediately after the call was missed.

To view the missed call immediately, proceed as follows.

1. If the phone is dosed, open the flip cover.
2. Press the View soft key.

## Deleting a Missed Call

You can press the $\boldsymbol{\Delta} / \mathbb{D}$ key at anytime to exit the Missed Call feature.

Noter You can access the Missed Call feature at any time by selecting the Missed Calls menu option (1.1); for further details, see page 56.

## Selecting Functions and Options

Your phone offers a set of functions that allow you to austomise your phone. These functions are arranged in menus and sub-menus, accessed via the two soft keys marked $\cdots$. Each menu and submenu allows you to view and alter the settings of a particular function.

The roles of the soft keys vary according to the current context; the labed on the bottomline of the display just above each key indicates its current role.

Press the left soft key to save the name entered.

Press the right soft key to switch between upper case, lower case and numeric characters.

## Phonebook

You can store phone numbers and their corresponding names in the memory of your SIM card In addition, you can store up to 99 numbers and names in the phone memory. The SIM card and phone memories, although physically separate, are used as if they were a single entity, called the phonebook.

## Storing a Plone Number wïth a Nanre

As soon as you start to enter a number, Save appears above the left soft key to allow you to store the number in the phonebook

1. Key in the number to be stored.

Note: If you make a mistake while entering a number, correct it using the C key. For further details, refer to page 24.
2. When you are sure that it is correct, press the Save soft key.
3. Enter the corresponding name (the maximum length depends on your SIM card). For information on how to enter a narre, see opposite.
4. When you are satisfied, press the OKsoft key. The phone now displays the first free location in the phone memory for you to save the number and name. If the phone memory is full, the first free location in the SIM card is displayed.
5. Press the right soft key to togile between the phone (To Phone) and card (To Card) memories.
6. If you do not want to save the number and name in the suggested location, press the $C$ key to dear the location number and enter your prefered location by pressing the number keys.
7. Press OKto store the name and number.
8. Press $\mathbf{\Delta} / \mathbb{1}$ to retum to the ide screen

When entering the same letter twice (or a different letter on the same key), just wait for a few seconds for the cursor to move right automatically, and then select the next letter. You can also move the cursor by using the < and > keys. To delete letters, press the Ckey.

## Speed dialling ly Menmy Location

Once you have stored phone numbers in the phone book memory, you can dial easily whenever you want.

To speed dial the desired number:
For the 1-digit memory location number (2 through 9), press and hold down the appropriate key.

For the 2 or more-digit memory location number, press the appropriate keys, then the $\#$ key.

## Searching for and Dialling a Number in the Phoneloook

1. When the ide screen is displayed, press the Name soft key. You are asked to enter a name.
2. Enter the start of the name that you want to find and press the Search soft key.

Note: You can also scroll through the phonebook fromthe beginning, by pressing the Search soft key directly.

The phonebook entries are listed, starting with the first entry matching your input. This entry is also highlighted.

## Paste

This option all lows you to paste the phonebook number into the nomal dialling mode Use this option to dial a number similar to one in the phonebook (a different extension in the same office for example).

Use the $C$ key to change the number as required (refer to page 24 for further details). When you are ready to dial, press the key.

## Edit

This option allows you to edit a number and name stored in the phonebook

## Erase

This option allows you to erase a number and name stored in the phonebook You are asked to confim that you wish to erase the name and number from the phonebook by pressing the Yes soft key.

## Copy

This option allows you to copy a phonebook number to another location Use this option to store a number similar to one already in memory, once copied, edit the number and store it in the phonebook.

## Galler Group

You can set the phone to ring in a spedific way and display a preselected graphic icon when a particular person calls you. To do so, you must:

- Define your caller groups
- Assign the numbers in the phonebook to the appropriate group


## Defining a celler group

You can define up to five caller groups.

1. In the ide mode, press the Name soft key.
2. Press the Options soft key.
3. Select the Caller group option.
4. Select the group to be defined.
5. Set the appropriate options.

The following options are available.
Call ring tone: allows you to select the ring tone to be used when you receive a voice phone call froma person in the group.
SMS tone: allows you to select the ring tone to be used when you receive a text message from person in the group.
Graphic: allows you to select the graphic icon to be displayed when you receive a call froma person in the group.
Group Name: allows you to assign a name to the group; for further details on how to enter characters, refer to page 35.

## Assigning numbers to a group

1. View the required number in the phonebook
2. Press the Options soft key.
3. Select the Caller Group option
4. Select the required group.

To remove a number froma group, select the No

## Group option.

## Mencry Status

You can chedk how many names and numbers are stored in the phonebook (card and phone memories). Proceed as follows.

1. In the idle mode, press the Name soft key.
2. Press the Options soft key.
3. Select the Memory Status option
4. Press Next to toggle between the card and phone memories.

SDN
You can view the list of Service Dialling Numbers (SDN) assigned by your network provider. Such numbers indude the emergency, directory enquiries and voice mail numbers.

1. In the ide mode, press the Name soft key.
2. Press the Options soft key.
3. Select the SDN option
4. Scroll through the numbers using the $\mathbf{V}$ and $\boldsymbol{\wedge}$ keys.
5. To dial the number displayed, press the Dial soft key.

Noter This option is available only when your service provider SIM card supports Service Dialling Numbers (SDN).

Your phone provides a number of control functions that you can use during a call.

## Puttinga Call an Hold

You can place the current call on hold whenever you want. You can make another call while you have a call in progress if this senice is supported by the network of these two calls, one is adive and the other is on hold and you can swap between the calls.

To place a call on hold, simply press the Hold soft key. You can reactivate the call whenever you want, by pressing the Unhold soft key.

To make a call while you have a call in progress, proceed as follows.

1. Key in the phone number that you wish to dial or look it up in the phonebook
2. Press the keyto dial the second call.

The first call is automatically put on hold.

Or altematively, proceed as follows.

1. Put the current call on hold by pressing the Hold soft key.
2. Make the second call in the normal way.

To swap between the two calls, simply press the Swap soft key.

The current call is placed on hold and the call on hold is reactivated so that you can continue conversing with the other party.

When you have finished, end each call nommally by pressing the $/ \mathbb{D}$ key.

## Suritching the Miaradnane Off (Mute)

You can temporarily switch your phone's microphone off, so that the other party cannot hear you.

Example: You wish to say something to another person in the roombut do not want the other party to hear you.

To switch the microphone off temporarily, proceed as follows.

1. Press the Options soft key.
2. If necessary, press the $\mathbf{V}$ key to highlight the Mute option.
3. Press the OKsoft key.

Your correspondent can no longer hear you.

To switch the microphone back on, proceed as follows.

1. Press the Options soft key.
2. If necessary, press the $V$ key to highlight the Unmute option.
3. Press the OK soft key.

Your correspondent can hear you again

## Muting Sending Key Tones

These options allow you to tum the key tones off or on. If the Mute keys option is selected, your phone does not transmit the key tones. It allows you to press keys without hearing annoying key tones during a call.

Noter To communicate with answering machines or computerised telephony systems, the Send keys option must be selected.

## Searding fior a Nunlber in the Phanelaook

You can search for a number in the phonebook during a call.

1. Press the Options soft key.
2. Press the $V$ key to highlight the Phonebook option.
3. Press the OK soft key.

The phonebook entries are listed.
4. Enter the name that you wish to find

If you enter the start of the name, the phonebook entries are listed, starting with the first entry matching your input. The entry is also highlighted.
5. To view the highlighted entry, press the View soft key.

For a more detailed description of the Phonebook feature, refer to page 34.

## Using the SMS Senvice

If you receive an SMS (Short Message Senvice) message during a call, the message icon ( $\Delta$ ) flashes in the display. The SMS Service option enables you to use this feature.

Read Messages: allows you to read the messages that you have received.

White Messages: allows you to write a message.

For further details on the SMS service, refer to page 59.

## Answering a Secand Call

You can answer an incoming call while you have a call in progress, if this service is supported by the network and you have set the Call Weiting menu option (7.3) to Activate (see page 94). You will be notified of an incoming call by a call waiting tone.

To answer a call while you have a call in progress, proceed as follows.

1. Press the key to answer the incoming call.

The first call is automatically put on hold
2. To switch between the two calls, press the Swap soft key.

To end a held call, press the Options soft key and select the End Held Call option.
3. To end the current call, press the $\boldsymbol{\Delta} / \mathbb{D}$ key.

## Making a Multiparty Call

A multiparty call is a network service that allows up to six people to take part simultaneously in a multiparty or conference call. For more information, contact your senvice provider.

## Setting upthe Mutiparty Call

1. Call the first participant in the nommal way.
2. Call the second participant in the normal way. The first call is automatically put on hold.
3. To join the first participant to the multiparty call, press the Options soft key and select the J oin option.
4. To add a new person to the multiparty call, call the person in the normal way, then press the Options soft key and select the J oin option

You can add incoming callers by answering the call and pressing Options, followed by J oin Repeat as required.

## Heving a Pivetre Conversation With One Participant

1. Press the Options soft key and choose the Select one option

The SMS (Short Message Senvice) function is a network service and may not be supported by your network Messages can be sent bytext, fax, E-mail and paging messaging systems, provided that these services are supported by your network To send text messages by phone, you must obtain the number of the SMS centre fromyour senvice provider.

When the icon appears, you have received new text messages. If the message memory is full, an error message is displayed and you cannot receive any new messages. Use the Delete option in the Read
Messages menu (21) to delete obsolete messages.

## Call Diverting

Call diverting can be set up in the following ways.
DivertAways: all calls are diverted
Busy: calls are diverted if you are already making another call.

No Reply: calls are diverted if you do not answer the phone.

Unreachalble: calls are diverted if you are not in an area covered by your senvice provider.

Cancel All: all call diverting options are cancelled.

You can spedify individual diverting options for each of the following call types:

- Voice calls only
- Faxcalls only
- Data calls only

- The battery is insufficiently charged. Replace the battery and recharge it.


## The aucio quality of thecall is poor

- Chedkthe signal strength indicator in the display ( $Y_{\text {.Illl }}$ ); the number of bars after it indicates the signal strength fromstrong ( $\Psi_{\text {, ill }}$ ) to weak ( $\Psi_{1}$ ).
- Try moving the phone slightly or moving doser to a window if you are in a building.

## Using the Batteries

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable Li-ion battery. The following batteries are also available (ask your SAMSUNG dealer for further details):

- Standard battery
- Slimbattery


## Precaulions When Using Batheries

- Never use any charger or battery that is darraged in any way.
- Use the battery only for its intended purpose.
- If you use the phone near the network's base station, it uses less power, talk and standby times are greatly affected by the signal strength on the cellular network and the parameters set by the network operator.
- Battery charging times depend on the remaining battery charge and the type of battery and charger used. The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will gradually wear out. When the operation time (talk kime and standby time) is noticeably shorter than nomral, it is time to buy a new battery.
- If left unused, a fully charged battery will discharge itself over time
- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and recharge your battery only with Samsung-approved chargers. When a charger is not in use, disconnect it from the power source Do not leave the battery conneded to a charger for more than a week, since overcharging may shorten its life.
- Extrere temperatures will affect the charging capacity of your battery: it may require cooling or warming first.
- Do not leave the battery in hot or cold places, such as in a car in summer or winter conditions, as you will reduce the capacity and life-time of the battery. Always try to keep the battery at room temperature. A phone with a hot or cold battery may temporarily not work, even when the battery is fully dharged $L$-ion batteries are particularly affected by temperatures below $\mathrm{O}^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\left(32^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right)$.
- Do not short-araiit the battery. Accidental short ciraiting can ocar when a metallic object (coin, dip or pen) causes a direct connedion between the +and - terminals of the battery (retal strips on the battery), for example when you carry a spare battery in a pocket or bag. Short-arcuiting the terminals may damage the battery or the object causing the short-cirait.
- Dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations. Always recyde. Do not dispose of batteries in a fire.

## Road Safiety

- Remember, road safety al ways comes first!
- Do not use a hand-held phone while driving a vetide. Always park the vehide before having a conversation.

- Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area and al ways switch off your phone whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger (in a hospital for example).
- Operation of any radio-transmitting equipment, induding cellular phones, may inteffere with inadequately protected medical devices. Consult a doctor or the manufacturer of the medical device if you have any questions. Oher electronic equiprent may also be subject to interference.
- As with other mobile radio-transmitting equipment, you are advised that for satisfactory operations and personal safety, the equiprent should only be used in the nommal operating position.
- Always switch off the phone when at a refuelling point (senvice station). You are reminded of the need to obsenve restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots (fuel storage and distribution areas), cherical plants or where blasting operations are in progress.

The use of cellular phones in an aircraft is illegal and may be dangerous to the operation of the aircraft or disnupt the cellular network Failure to obseme these instructions may lead to the suspension or derial of cellular telephone services to the offender, legal action or both


## Care and Maintenance

Your phone is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care The suggestions below will help you fulfill the warranty odligations and enjoy this product for many years.

- Keep the phone and all its parts and accessories out of the reach of small children
- Keep the phone dry. Precipitation, humidity and liquids containing minerals will corrode the electronic ciraits.
- Do not use or store the phone in dusty, dirty areas as its components may be damaged.
- Do not store the phone in hot areas. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries and wamp or melt certain plastics.
- Do not store the phone in cold areas. When the phone wams up to its nomal temperature, moisture can forminside the phone, which may damage the electronic circuits.
- Do not attempt to open the phone's casing. Non-expert handing of the phone may damage it.
- Do not drop or knock the phone. Rough handing may damage the intemal circits.
- Do not use harsh chericals, deaning solvents or strong detergents to dean the phone. Wipe it with a soft doth slightly dampened in mild, soapy water.
- If the phone or any of its accessories are not working properly, take themto your nearest qualified senvice centre. The personnel there will assist you, and if necessary, arrange for the phone to be repaired.


## Energency Calls

Important This phone, like any cellular phone, uses radio signals, cellular and landline networks, as well as user-programmed functions that cannot guarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore, you should never rely solely on any cellular phone for essential communications (medical emergencies for example).

Remenber, to make or receive any calls, the phone must be switched on and in a senvice area with adequate cellular signal strength.

Emergency calls may not be possible on all celluar phone networks or when cetain network senvices and/or phone features are in use Chedk with local cellular senvice providers.

To help you understand the main tednical terms and abbreviations used in this booklet and take full advantage of the features on your mobile phone, here are a few definitions.

## Adive Rip

Ability to answer a call simply by opening the phone.

## Call Baring

Ability to restrict outgoing and incoming calls.

## Gall Diverting

Ability to reroute calls to another mobile or fixed line.

## Call Halding

Ability to put one call on standby while answering or making another call; you can then switch between the two calls, as required

## Call Maiting

Ability to informusers that they have an incoring call when engaged on another call.

## DCS

Digital cellular network standard based on the GSM network arditecture. With the higher frequency range ( $1800 \mathrm{MH} z$ for DCS instead of 900 MH Z for GSM), more radio channels can be made available, thus allowing the network to support more subscribers and traffic.

## Dual Band

Ability to operate with both DCS ( 1800 MH ) and GSM ( 900 MHZ ) networks. The phone automatically uses the network with the strongest signal and even switches networks during a call within the same operator's network

## GSM (Gdael Systemfor Molile Communication)

Intemational standard for cellular communication, guaranteeing compatibility between the various network operators. GSM covers most European countries and many other parts of the world.

## Line Identification Senvices

Services allowing subscribers to view or block the telephone numbers of callers.

## Muli-party Calling

Ability to establish a conference call involving up to five additional parties.

## Phone Passward

Searity code used to unlodk the phone when you have selected the option to lock it automatically each time it switches on.

## PIN (Personel Identification Nunber)

Security code that protects the phone against unauthorised use. The PIN is supplied by the senvice provider with the SIM card. It may be a four to eightdigit number and can be changed, as required.

## PUK(PIN Unldoding Key)

Security code used to unlodk the phone when an incorrect PIN has been entered three times in succession. The eight-digit number is supplied by the senvice provider with the SIM card.

## Roaming

Use of your phone when you are outside your home area (when travelling for example).

## SDN (Senvice Dialling Nunbers)

Telephone numbers supplied by your network provider and giving access to special services, such as voice mail, directory inquiries, austomer support and emergency services.

## SIM (Subsariber Identification Module)

Card containing a dhip with all the information required to operate the phone (network and memory information, as well as the subscriber's personal data). The SIM card fits into a small slot on the back of the phone and is protected by the battery.

## SMS (Short Message Senvice)

Network senvice sending and receiving messages to and fromanother subscriber without having to speak to the correspondent. The message created or received (up to 160 characters long) can be displayed, received, edited or sent.

## Soft Keys

Keys marked ... on the phone, the punpose of which:

- Varies according to the function that you are currently using
- Is indicated on the bottomline of the display just above the corresponding key


## Vaice Mail

Computerised answering service that automatically answers your calls when you are not available, plays a greeting (optionally in your own voice) and records a message.
