Follow any spedial regulations in force in any area and al ways switch off your phone whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger (in a hospital for example).

All mobile phones may be subject to rado interference, which may affect their performance.

## Qualified senvice

Orly qualified service personnel must repair cellular equipment. Use only approved accessories and batteries.

## Baddight

The display is illuminated by a baddight. When you press any key, the baddight illuminates. It tums off if no key is pressed within a given period of time, depending on the Back Light option in the Phone Settings menu.

To spedify the length of time for which the baddight is adive, set the Back Light menu option (451); see page 80 for further details.

## External Display

Your phone has an extemal display on the cover. It indicates that you have an incoming call or a message, and notifies you at the spedified time when you have set an alarm

When you press and hold down the volurre keys on the left side of the phone with the phone dosed, the baddight of the extemal display illuminates.

## Senvice Light:

The service light is in the top right-hand comer of the phone. It flashes when services are available on the phone

To adivate or deactivate use of the service light, set the Senice Light menu option (4.52); see page 80 for further details.


## Yaur First Call

The following diagramexplains the main steps required when making your first call and indicates the pages on which you can find more detailed instructions.


## Installing the SIM Card

When you subscribe to a cellular network, you are provided with a plug-in SIM card loaded with your subsaription details (PIN, optional senvices available and so on).

Important: The plug-in SIM card and its contacts can be easily damaged by scratches or bending, so be careful when handling, inserting or removing the card.

Keep all SIM cards out of the reach of small children.

1. If necessary, switch off the phone by hol ding down the $\mathbf{A} /(1$ key until the SAMSUNG message is displayed.
2. Remove the battery. To do so:
(1) Push down and hold the catch above the battery on the back of the phone.
(2) Slide the battery away, as shown.

3. Slide the SIM card into the SIM card holder so that the holder lods the card in position.


Note: When you need to remove the SIM card, slide it towards the top of the phone and take it out of the holder.

4. Place the battery back on the phone. Slide the battery up towards the catch until it dids into place. Make sure that the battery is properly installed before switching on the power.


## Charging a Bathery

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable Li-ion battery. A travel adapter is provided with your phone Use only approved batteries and chargers. Ask your local SAMSUNG dealer for further details.

The phone can be used while the battery is charging.
Note: You must fully charge the battery before using your phone for the first time. A discharged battery is fully recharged in approximately 200 minutes.

1. With the battery in position on the phone, connect the lead from the travel adapter to the bottom of the phone. Chedk that the arrow on the lead connector is facing towards the front of the phone.

2. Connect the adapter to a standard AC wall outlet.
3. When charging is finished, disconnect the adapter from the pover outlet and from the phone by pressing the gray tabs on both sides of the connector and pulling the connector out.


## Low Bethery Indicatior

When the battery is weak and only a few minutes of talk time remain, you will hear a waming tone and a message will be repeated at regular intenals on the display:


When the battery becomes too weak for the phone to operate, it switches off automatically.

Note: The display language is factory set to English. To change the language, use the Language menu option (44); for further details, refer to page 80.
5. When you wish to switch the phone off, hold down the - /(1) key for more than two seconds.

## Access Cooles

There are several access codes that are used by your phone and its SIM card. These codes help you protect the phone against unauthorised use.

When requested for any of the codes explained below, key in the appropriate code (displayed as asterisks) and press the OK soft key. If you make a mistake, press the C key one or more times until the incorrect digit is deared and then continue entering the correct code.

The access codes (except for the PUK and PUK2 codes) can be changed using Security menu options. See page 92 for further details.

Important: Avoid using access codes resembling emergency numbers, such as 112 , so that you do not dial an emergency number accidentally.

## Phone Passunard

The Phone Lodk feature uses the phone password to protect your phone against unauthorised use. The phone password is supplied with the phone and is factory set to 00000000 .

## PIN

## PUK

2. Enter a new PIN of your choice and press the OKsoft key.
3. When the ConfirmNew PIN message is displayed, key in the same code again and press the OK soft key.

If you enter an incorrect PUK ten times in succession, the SIM card becomes invalid. Contact your senvice provider for a new card.

## PIND

The PIN2 (4 to 8 digits), supplied with some SIM cards, is required to access specific fundions, such as setting the maximumcost of a call. These fundions are available if supported by your SIM card.

If you enter an incorrect PIN2 three times in succession, the code is disabled and you cannot access the fundions until you re-enable it by entering the PUK2.

To change the PIN2, refer to page 95 (menu option 67).

## PUR

The 8-digit PUK2 (Personal Unbloding Key 2), supplied with some SIM cards, is required to change a disabled PIN2. If you lose the code, contact your senice provider.

To re-enable your PIN2, proceed as follows.

1. Key in the PUK2 and press the OK soft key.
2. Enter a new PIN2 of your choice and press the OKsoft key.
3. When the ConfimPINR message is displayed, key in the same code again and press the OKsoft key.

If you enter an incorrect PUK2 ten times in succession, you will not be able to access the functions requiring the PIN2. Contact your senice provider for a new card.

The 4-digit barring password is required when you use the Call Barring fundion You dbtain the password from your senvice provider when you subscribe to this function See page 98 for further details.

When the idle screen is displayed, key in the area code and phone number and press the key.

Note: If you have set the Auto Redial menu option (46) to ON (see page 81) and the person called does not answer or is already on the phone, the number is redialled automatically up to ten times.

If the caller can be identified, the caller's phone number (or name if stored in your phonebook) is displayed. If the caller cannot be identified, only the phone icon flashes.

If the Anykey Answer menu option (48) is set to ON, you can press any key to answer a call except for the $\mathbf{S} / \mathbb{1}$ key and the Reject soft key (see page 82).

## Phonebook

You can store phone numbers and their corresponding names in the memory of your SIM card. In addition, you can store up to 99 numbers and names in the phone memory. The SIM card and phone memories, although physically separate, are used as if they were a single entity, called the phonebook.

## SDN

You can view the list of Service Dialling Numbers (SDN) assigned by your network provider. Such numbers indude the errergency, directory enquiries and voice mail numbers.

3. Select the SDN option
4. Saroll through the numbers using the $\Im$ and $\curvearrowleft$ keys.
5. To dial the number displayed, press the Dial soft key.

Note: This option is available only when your SIM card supports Service Dialling Numbers (SDN).

When using your phone, you will often need to enter text. For example, when storing a name in the phonebook, qreating your personal greeting or scheduling events in your calendar. You can enter al phanumeric characters by using your phone's keypad.

You are provided with the following text input modes.

## - T9mode

This mode allows you to enter words with only one keystroke per letter. Each key on the keypad has more than one letter - when you press the (5mey keyce, J , K or L may be displayed. The 19 mode automatically compares your keystrokes with an internal linguistic didionary to determine the correct word, thus requiring far fewer keystrokes than the traditional upper/lover-case character modes.

## - Upper/lower-case character modes

These modes allow you to enter letters by pressing the key labelled with the required letter once, twice or three times until the letter is displayed.

## - Number mode

This mode allows you to enter numbers.

## Chenging the Text Input Mode

When you are in a field that allows characters to be entered, you will notice the text input mode indicator in the display.

- To type words not found in the $T 9$ mode, change the text input mode to the upper/lover-case character input mode Words typed in these character modes are automatically added to the 19 dictionary so that you can type themnext time using the 19 mode.
- To enter full stops, hyphens or apostrophes, press (100). The 19 mode applies grammar rules to ensure that the correct punctuation is used.
Example: (100) is used twice to display two punctuation marks:

- To change the case in the T9 mode, use the (*) key.
- You can move the cursor by using the $($ and $)$ keys. To delete letters, press the $\mathbf{C}$ key. Press and hold down the $C$ key to dear the display.


## Using the Upperl Lower-Case Character Mode

Use the (100) to (9men) keys to enter your text.

- To insert a space, press the (\#) key.
- You can move the cursor by using the $(S$ and $)$ keys. To delete letters, press the $C$ key. Press and hold down the $\mathbf{C}$ key to dear the display.


## Using the Number Mode

The Number mode enables you to enter numbers in a text message (a telephone number for example). Press the keys corresponding to the required digits before manually switching back to the appropriate text entry mode.

Your phone provides a number of control fundions that you can use during a call.

## Putting a Call an Hold

You can place the current call on hold whenever you want. You can make another call while you have a call in progress if this service is supported by the network of these two calls, one is active and the other is on hold and you can swap between the calls.

To place a call on hold, simply press the Hold soft key. You can readivate the call whenever you want, by pressing the Unhold soft key.

To make a call while you have a call in progress, proceed as follows.

1. Key in the phone number that you wish to dial or look it up in the phonebook
2. Press the keyto dial the second call. The first call is automatically put on hold.

Or altematively, proceed as follows.

1. Put the current call on hold by pressing the Hold soft key.
2. Make the second call in the normal way.

To swap between the two calls, simply press the Swap soft key.

The current call is placed on hold and the call on hold is reactivated so that you can continue conversing with the other party.

When you have finished, end each call nomally by pressing the $\mathbf{\square} / \mathbb{1}$ key.

## Switching the Micradhane Off (Mute)

You can temporarily switch your phone's microphone off, so that the other party cannot hear you.

Example: You wish to say something to another person in the roombut do not want the other party to hear you.

To switch the microphone off temporarily, proceed as follows.

1. Press the Options soft key.
2. If necessary, press the key to highlight the Mute option
3. Press the OKsoft key.

The other party can no longer hear you

To switch the microphone back on, proceed as follows.

1. Press the Options soft key.
2. If necessary, press the $\circlearrowleft$ key to highlight the Unmute option.
3. Press the OK soft key.

The other party can hear you again.

## Muting' Sending Key Tones

These options allow you to tum the key tones off or on If the Mute keys option is selected, your phone does not transmit the key tones. It allows you to press keys without hearing annoying key tones during a call.

Note: To communicate with answering machines or computerised telephony systems, the Send keys option must be selected.

## Searding fior a Number in the Phanelook

You can search for a number in the phonebook during a call.

1. Press the Options soft key.
2. Press the key to highlight the Phonebook option
3. Press the OK soft key.

The phonebook entries are listed.
4. Enter the name that you wish to find.

If you enter the start of the name, all phonebook entries are listed, starting with the first entry matching your input. The entry is also highlighted.
5. To view the highlighted entry, press the Kiew soft key.

For a more detailed description of the Phonebook feature, refer to page 36.

## Using the SMS Senvice

If you receive an SMS (Short Message Senvice) message during a call, the message icon ( $\triangle$ ) flashes in the display. The SMS Senvice option enables you to use this feature

Read Messages: allows you to read the messages that you have received.

Write Messages: allows you to write a message.

For further details on the SMS senice, refer to page 65.

## Answering a Second Call

You can answer an incoming call while you have a call in progress, if this senvice is supported by the network and you have set the Call Weiting menu option (7.3) to Activate (see page 100). You will be notified of an incoming call by a call waiting tone.

To answer a call while you have a call in progress, proceed as follows.

1. Press the keyto answer the incoming call.

The first call is automatically put on hold.
2. To switch between the two calls, press the Swap soft key.

To end a held call, press the Options soft key and select the End Held Call option.
3. To end the current call, press the $\mathbf{A} /(1)$ key.

## Maling a Multiparty Call

A multiparty call is a network senvice that allows up to six people to take part simultaneously in a multiparty or conference call. For more information, contact your sevice provider.

## Setting upthe Multiparty Call

1. Call the first participant in the nommal way.
2. Call the second participant in the nomal way. The first call is automatically put on hold.
3. To join the first participant to the multiparty call, press the Options soft key and select thel oin option
4. To add a new person to the multiparty call, call the person in the nommal way, then press the Options soft key and select the $\boldsymbol{J}$ oin option.

You can add incoming callers by answering the call and pressing Options, followed by J oin Repeat as required.

## Having a Private Conversation Wih One Participant:

1. Press the Options soft key and choose the Select one option.
The list of call participants appears.

## Using the Menus

2. Highlight the required person, by pressing the $\curvearrowleft$ or $\because$ key, followed by the Select soft key or the $P$ key.
3. Select Private.

Now you can talk privately with that person. The other participants can continue to converse with each other.
4. To retum to the multiparty call, press the Options soft key and select J oin
All the multiparty call participants can now hear each other.

## Drqping One Participant

1. Press the Options soft key and choose the Select one option.
The list of call participants appears.
2. Highlight the required person, by pressing the $\curvearrowleft$ or $\Longleftarrow$ key, followed by the Select soft key or the $r$ key.
3. Select Remove.

The call is ended with that participant, but you can continue to tall $k$ with the other participants.
4. End the multiparty call by dosing the phone or pressing the $\mathbf{T} / \mathbb{D}$ key.

The phone offers a range of functions that allow you to tailor the phone to your needs. These functions are arranged in menus and sub-menus.

The menus and sub-menus can be accessed by using the navigation keys or by using the index system

## Using the Newigztion Keys

The navigation keys are used as follows.
Key Purpose
Moves to the next option on the same
level as the one displayed.
Moves to the previous option on the same

Selects the option displayed.
Goes badk to the previous menu level.

You can also use the $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ and $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ keys on the left side of the phone to move to the next or previous option on the same level as the one displayed.

Example: accessing the Language option.

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Scroll through the menus by using the $\leadsto$ and Q keys until Phone Settings is displayed, then press the Selectsoft key or the $)$ key.
3. Saroll through the options by pressing the $\curvearrowright$ and $\curvearrowleft$ keys until Language is displayed, then press the Selectsoft key or the ) key.

The languages available are displayed.

## Using the Index System

When the icon appears, you have received new text messages. If the message memory is full, an error message is displayed and you cannot receive any new messages. Use the Delete option in the Read

Messages menu (21) to delete obsolete messages.

## Read Messages

If the above guidelines do not enable you to solve the problem take a note of:

- The model and serial numbers of your phone
- Your warranty details
- A dear description of the problem

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable L-ion battery. The following batteries are also available (ask your SAMSUNG dealer for further details):

- Standard battery
- Slimbattery


## Precautions When Using Batheries

- Never use any charger or battery that is damaged in any way.
- Use the battery only for its intended purpose.
- If you use the phone near the networks base station, it uses less power, talk and standby times are greatly affected by the signal strength on the cellular network and the parameters set by the network operator.
- Battery charging times depend on the remaining battery charge and the type of battery and charger used. The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will gradually wear out. When the operation time (talk time and standby time) is noticeably shorter than nommal, it is time to buy a new battery.
- If left unused, a fully charged battery will discharge itself over time


## Safety Information

- Use orly Samsung-approved batteries and recharge your battery only with Samsung-approved chargers. When a charger is not in use, disconnect it from the power source. Do not leave the battery connected to a charger for more than a week, since overdharging may shorten its life.
- Extreme temperatures will affect the charging capacity of your battery: it may require cooling or warming first.
- Do not leave the battery in hot or cold places, such as in a car in summer or winter conditions, as you will reduce the capadity and life-time of the battery. Always try to keep the battery at roomtemperature. A phone with a hot or cold battery may temporarily not work, even when the battery is fully charged Li-ion batteries are particularly affected by temperatures below $\mathrm{O}^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\left(32^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right)$.
- Do not short-arait the battery. Accidental short ciraiting can ocar when a metallic object (coin, dip or pen) causes a direct connection between the +and teminals of the battery (metal strips on the battery), for example when you carry a spare battery in a pocket or bag. Short-ciraiting the teminals may damage the battery or the object causing the short-dirait.
- Dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations. Always recyde. Do not dispose of batteries in a fire.


## Road Safiety

- Remember, road safety always comes first!

## Operating Envirannent

- Remenber to follow any spedial regulations in force in any area and al ways switch off your phone whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger (in a hospital for example).
- Operation of any radio-transmitting equipment, ind uding cellular phones, may interfere with inadequately protected medical devices. Consult a doctor or the manufacturer of the medical device if you have any questions. Other electronic equipment may also be subject to interference.
- As with other mobile radio-transmitting equipment, you are advised that for satisfactory operations and personal safety, the equipment should only be used in the normal operating position
- Always switch off the phone when at a refuelling point (senice station). You are reminded of the need to observe restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots (fuel storage and distribution areas), cherrical plants or where blasting operations are in progress.
- Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts or accessories.
- Switch off your cellular phone when in airraft. The use of cellular phones in aircraft is illegal and may be dangerous to the operation of the aircraft or disrupt the cellular network Failure to observe these instructions may lead to the suspension or derial of cellular telephone services to the offender, legal action or both.


## Care and Maintenance

Your phone is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care The suggestions below will help you fulfill the warranty obligations and enjoy this product for many years.

- Keep the phone and all its parts and accessories out of the reach of small children.
- Keep the phone dry. Preapitation, humidity and liquids containing minerals will corrode the electronic craits.
- Do not use or store the phone in dusty, dirty areas as its components may be damaged.
- Do not store the phone in hot areas. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries and warp or melt certain plastics.
- Do not store the phone in cold areas. When the phone warms up to its nomal temperature, moisture can forminside the phone, which may darmage the electronic ciraits.
- Do not attempt to open the phone's casing. Non-expert handling of the phone may damage it.
- Do not drop or knodk the phone. Rough handing may damage the intemal circuits.


## Glossary of Terms

- Do not use harsh chericals, deaning solvents or strong detergents to dean the phone Wipe it with a soft doth slighty dampened in mild, soapy water.
- If the phone or any of its accessories are not working properly, take themto your nearest qualified service centre. The personnel there will assist you, and if necessary, arrange for the phone to be repaired.


## Energency Calls

Important: This phone, like any cellular phone, uses radio signals, cellular and landline networks, as well as user-programmed functions that cannot guarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore, you should never rely solely on any cellular phone for essential communications (medical emergencies for example).

Remember, to make or receive any calls, the phone must be switched on and in a sevice area with adequate cellular signal strength.

Emergency calls may not be possible on all cellular phone networks or when certain network services and/or phone features are in use. Chedk with local cellular senvice providers.

To help you understand the main tednical terms and abbreviations used in this booklet and take full advantage of the features on your mobile phone, here are a few definitions.

## Adive Rip

Ability to answer a call simply by opening the phone.

## Call Barring

Ability to restrict outgoing and incoring calls.

## Call Diverting

Ability to reroute calls to another number.

## Call Holding

Ability to put one call on standby while answering or making another call; you can then switch between the two calls, as required.

## Call Maiting

Ability to informusers that they have an incorring call when engaged on another call.

## DCS

Digital cellular network standard based on the GSM network architecture With the higher frequency range ( 1800 MH $Z$ for DCS instead of $900 \mathrm{MH} Z$ for GSM), more radio channels can be made available, thus allowing the network to support more subscribers and traffic.

## Dual Band

Ability to operate with both DCS ( 1800 MH ) and GSM ( 900 MHz ) networks. The phone automatically uses the network with the strongest signal and even switches networks during a call within the same operator's network

## GSM (Gdazl Systemfor Madile Communication)

Intemational standard for cellular commuication, guaranteeing compatibility between the various network operators. GSM covers most European countries and many other parts of the world.

## Line Identification Senvices (Caller ID)

Services allowing subscribers to view or block the telephone numbers of callers.

## Mutiparty Calling

Ability to establish a conference call innolving up to five additional parties.

## Phone Passucrd

Searity code used to unlock the phone when you have selected the option to lock it automatically each time it switches on.

## PIN (Personel Identification Nunber)

Security code that protects the phone against unauthorised use. The PIN is supplied by the service provider with the SIM card. It may be a four to eightdigit number and can be changed, as required.

## PUK (PIN Undodking Key)

Searity code used to unlodk the phone when an incorrect PIN has been entered three times in succession The eight-digit number is supplied by the service provider with the SIM card.

## Roaning

Use of your phone when you are outside your home area (when travelling for example).

## SDN (Senvice Dialling Numbers)

Telephone numbers supplied by your network provider and giving access to special services, such as voice mail, directory inquiries, austomer support and emergency senvices.

## SIM (Subsariber Identification Module)

Card containing a dip with all the information required to operate the phone (network and memory information, as well as the subscriber's personal data). The SIM card fits into a small slot on the back of the phone and is protected by the battery.

## SMS (Short Message Senvice)

Network service sending and receiving messages to and fromanother subsciber without having to speak to the correspondent. The ressage created or received (up to 160 charaders long) can be displayed, received, edited or sent.

## Soft Keys

Two keys ( $\because$ ) on the phone, the purpose of which:

- Varies according to the fundion that you are currently using
- Is indicated on the bottomline of the display just above the corresponding key


## Vaice Mail

Computerised answering service that automatically answers your calls when you are not available, plays a greeting (optionally in your own voice) and records a message.
